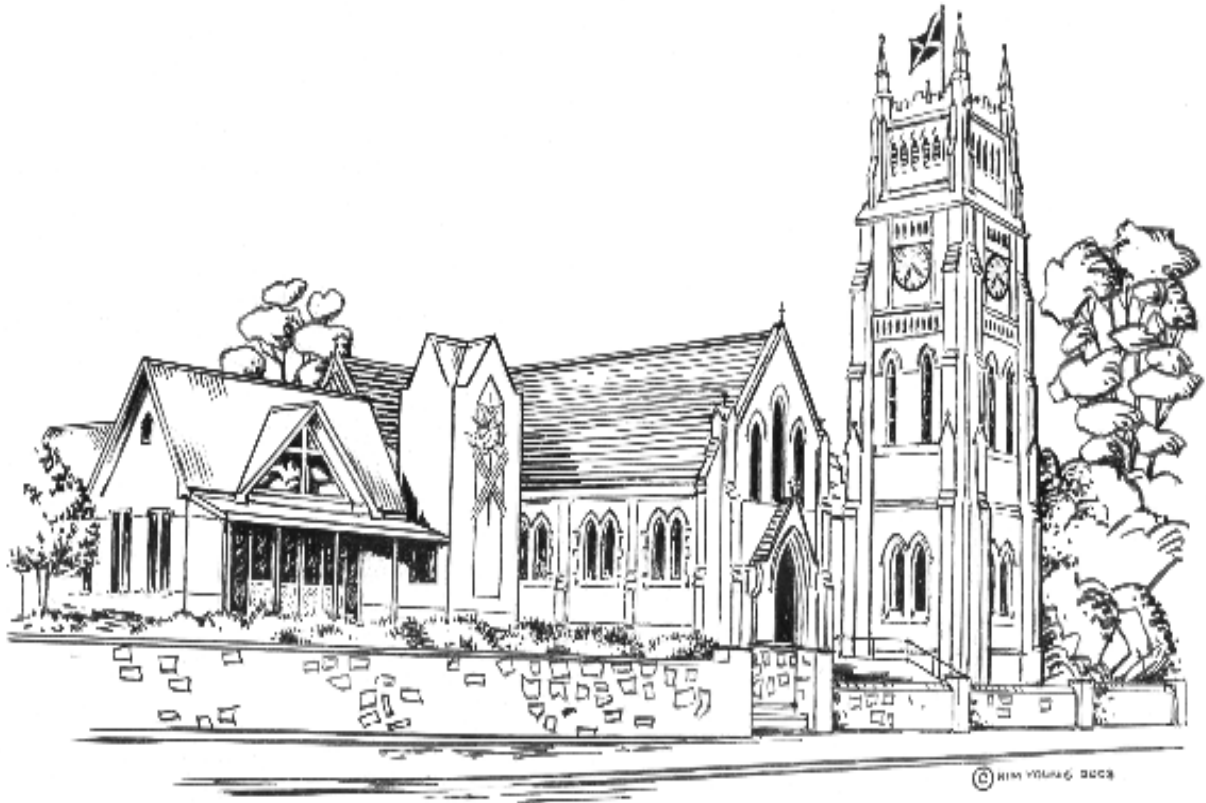

1st Reading: Exodus 20.1-4, 7-9, 12-20

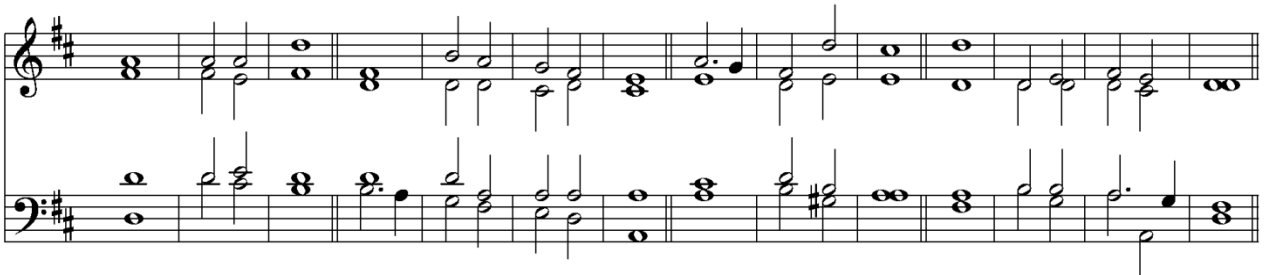
OT p. 62

The story of Exodus, the escape of the Israelites from Egypt and the journey through the wilderness, climaxes in the encounter with God on Mount Sinai. God gives what is popularly known as the Ten Commandments (known in Hebrew as the 'Ten Words'). Importantly, these are given after their rescue from Egypt and nourishment in the desert; they are a gift to keep Israel in relationship with God and with each other.

Psalm: Psalm 19. (*sung*)

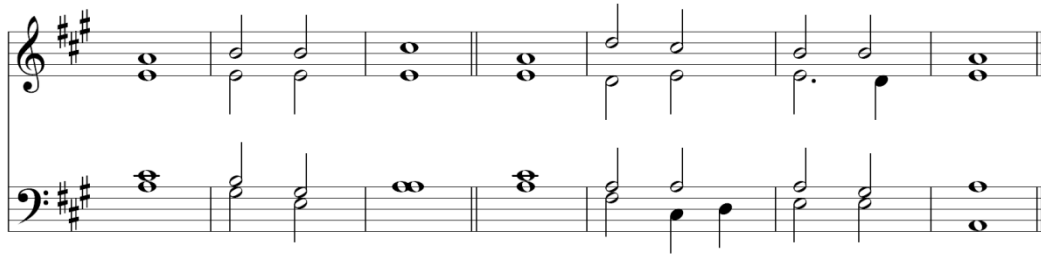
Because of this psalm's focus on 'law' and 'teaching,' it sits comfortably alongside Exodus 20. The first part tells of the glory of God in creation, while the second focuses on the 'law of the Lord' and our response to it. Like the thunder and lightning at the giving of the law on Mt Sinai, so the heavens proclaim the glory of God.

2nd Reading: Philippians 3.4b-14

In chapter 3 of this letter, Paul is addressing the issue of false teachers. Today's passage is part of his debate with the "circumcision party" where Paul argues that he will not rely on his impressive Jewish credentials to live the fullness of God's new life, but on grace - found through faith in Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 21.33-46

This parable is the second of a group of three where Jesus challenges the religious leadership of Israel. Just like the prophets before him, Jesus will be rejected too. For Matthew's community, this story helps them understand why the Messiah was rejected, and, at the same time, challenges them to bear fruit through loving service.
