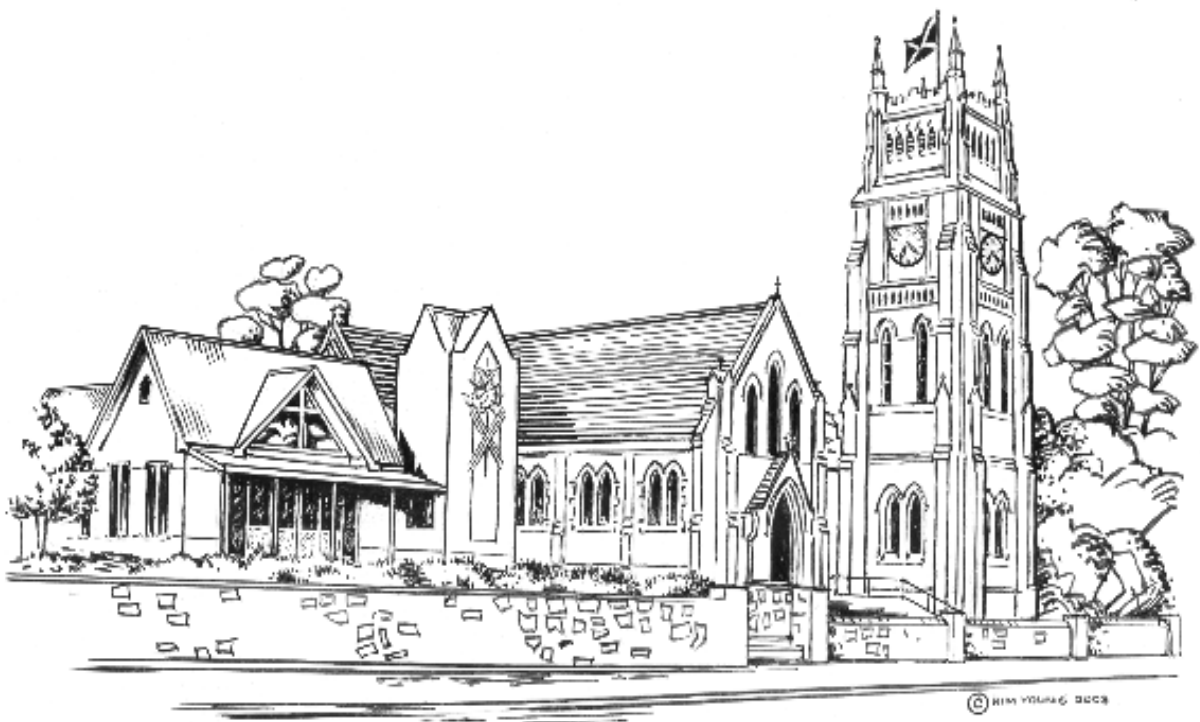

## Readings

1<sup>st</sup> Reading: 2 Kings 2.1-12 OT p. 310

*Today's passage is the last in the Elijah cycle of stories. Elisha succeeds Elijah as a "man of God" by picking up Elijah's prophetic mantle. Elisha follows a line of prophets going back to Moses, and in spite of any sense of inadequacy or inappropriate desire, stands as a true prophet of God. Note the parallels with today's Gospel reading: the recall of Moses and Elijah, the mysterious transformation of the central character in the presence of his disciple(s), and the 'passing'*

of a 'mantle' to the disciple(s). Both stories speak of the divine authority given to Elijah

Psalm: Psalm 50.1-6

APBA p. 272

*The visual imagery in this psalm has connections with the whirlwind which removes Elijah from sight in the first reading, and the transfigured radiance of Jesus in today's Gospel. The description in verses 3 to 6 recalls the appearance of God to Moses on Mount Sinai.*

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: 2 Corinthians 4.3-12

NT p. 167

*Paul reminds the Christians at Corinth that his message was never about self-interest, but about proclaiming Jesus Christ as Lord. He describes God's presence using words like light, glory, or glow; Christ reflects God's light and shows us God's glory. Paul goes on to acknowledge that God's light shines through human frailty (earthen vessels).*

Gospel: Mark 9.2-9

NT p. 41

*This account of Jesus' transfiguration recalls Moses' encounter on Mt Sinai. The appearance of Jesus is a glimpse of a kind of life that is beyond earthly eyes. Peter's attempt to build booths both reflects the practice of the Jewish Feast of Booths where men and boys lived in tents to remember the Exodus, and his attempt to secure the experience in some tangible way. A voice proclaims to the crowd Jesus' true identity, as it did at his baptism, and then, at the end, the disciples must fix their eyes on Jesus alone. Today is a transition day that connects the theme of the Sundays after Epiphany (the manifestation of God) to the theme of Lent (renewing our discipleship), just as the vision of the transfigured Christ prefigures our transfiguration this Lent and Easter.*

## At St Andrew's

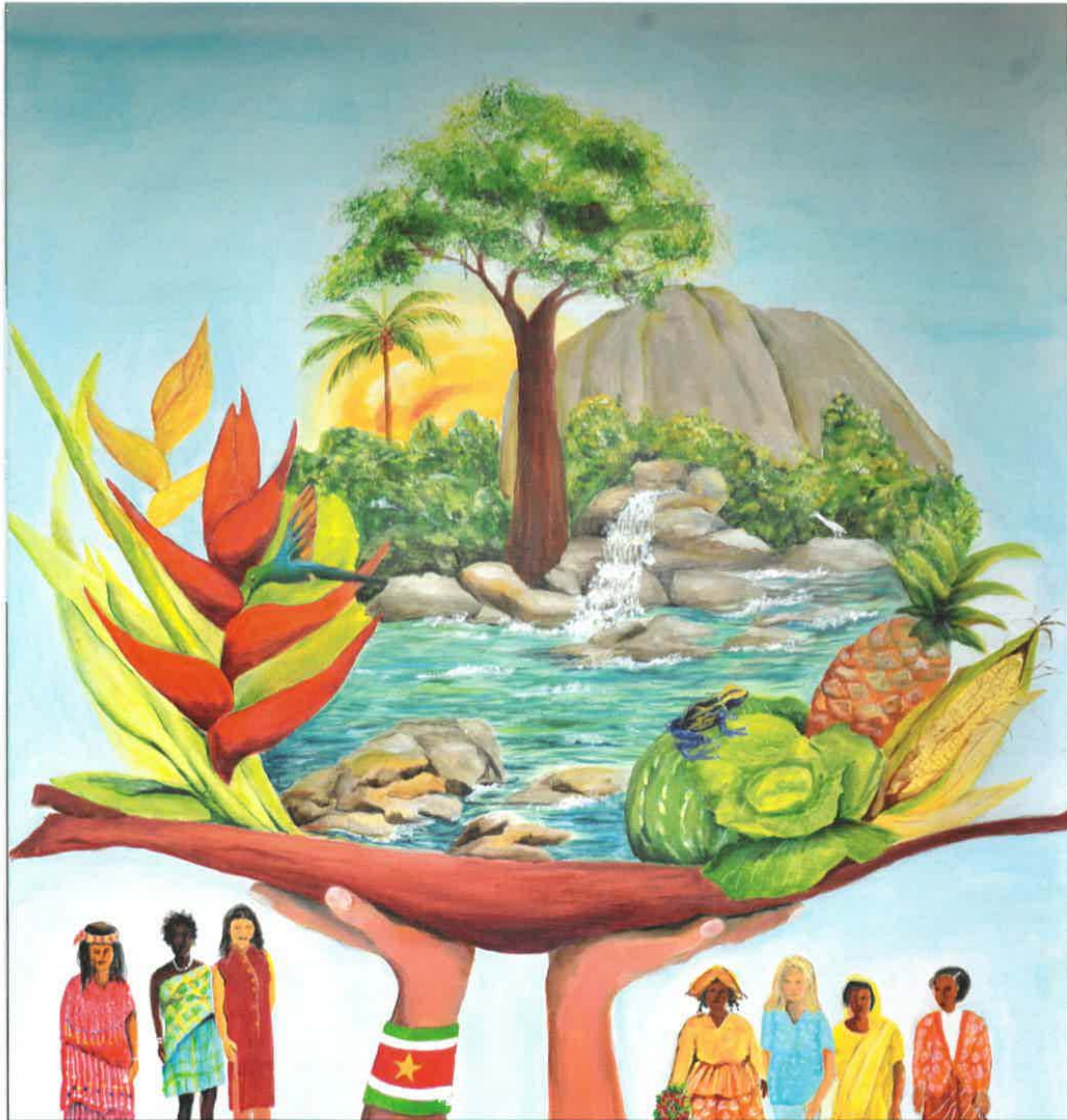
