

May our worship be the offering of our hearts and lives to you.


Help us to reach out in welcome to newcomers and visitors,

Psalm: Psalm 147.1-11


This psalm of praise is one of five that concludes the book of Psalms (called in Hebrew 'tehillim' which means 'praise.') Each of these five psalms starts with the call to 'Praise the Lord!' Psalm 147 is a psalm of praise about what God is doing: restoring, healing and lifting up the weak, which is what God did for the exiles returning from Babylon.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 9.16-23 NT p. 159

Paul continues his theme from last week: the members of the Church in Corinth must do what is needed for the weaker members among them. Paul responds to his critics by arguing that he will be an observant Jew when with observant Jews and not so when with Gentiles, in other words, to do whatever is required to strengthen the faith of 'weaker' members. He does not mean 'anything goes' for the law of Christ is more demanding than the biblical law, but his priority remains preaching the gospel and helping others know Christ's love.

Gospel: Mark 1.29-39 OT p. 33

The manifestation of Christ (Epiphany) continues with Mark's description of Jesus' intensive ministry of healing and exorcism in the Capernaum area. This ministry explains why the Kingdom of Heaven is good news: people are healed and liberated. Jesus will not let the crowds at the door, or the 'celebrity game,' deprive him of prioritising his (and universally human) dependency on God in prayer.
