

### Readings

1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Acts 3.12-20

NT p. 111

*During the 50 days of the Easter season, the first reading comes from the Book of Acts instead of the Old Testament. Preceding this passage, we are told of what the early church did in the days after Jesus' resurrection. They met together, shared all they had, and they still went to the temple every day (2:46, 3:1). Peter and John encounter and heal a man lame from birth at the temple gate, and a crowd gathers around them as the three men enter the temple together. Today's text is the first part of Peter's address to the assembled people, who are filled with wonder and amazement at the healing.*

Psalm: Psalm 4 (*said*)

APBA p. 225

*This psalm in the opening verses appears at first to be a lament. But the latter part of the psalm expresses the strong confidence of the author in God's presence. There is an ascription to the psalm, 'A Psalm of David' which may imply David is the author, or is about David's life, and so the context is David's own sinfulness and repentance. Just like the risen Jesus appearing to the disciples, so God speaks peace to us when all around is turmoil, confusion and disbelief.*

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: 1 John 2.15-17, 3.1-6

NT p. 222

*The Letters of John are so called because of their similar style and concerns in John's Gospel. Today's passage describes people of faith as 'children of God' as long as we abide in Jesus, and yet the author combines this bold assertion with the humble acknowledgement that "what we will be" is not yet revealed (3:2). It is about how much we open ourselves to receive the love which God gives, which in turn flows through us to others.*

Gospel: Luke 24.36b-48

NT p. 84

*Although this is the year of Mark when we hear from Mark's Gospel, the lack of resurrection stories in Mark mean that the lectionary turns to the Gospels of John and Luke for the Easter season. Today's story from Luke, tells of the evening of Easter Day following the appearance of Jesus on the road to Emmaus. It is similar to last week's story from John's Gospel when Thomas was not present. From this experience, the early Church understood its true mission: to proclaim that the prophecies of the Messiah had now been fulfilled and that repentance and forgiveness of sins were now available through faith in Jesus.*
