

## Readings

1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Acts 4.5-13

NT p. 112

*The fourth Sunday in Easter is known as Shepherd Sunday, where the lectionary provides readings that relate to the image of God as Shepherd. This passage shows the role of Church leaders as Shepherds who rescue and proclaim. Peter and John's roles as Shepherd are demonstrated in the healing that occurs just prior to this passage. A crippled beggar has been healed by Peter and John in the Temple precinct, Peter then preaches, but both Peter and John are arrested by the Temple Guards. On the following day they appear before the Sanhedrin and today's passage tells us what happens.*

Psalm: Psalm 23 (said)

APBA p. 243

*This psalm is the most well-known psalm in the psalter. Appropriate for 'Shepherd Sunday' this pastoral image of the Lord's shepherd-like care is only used in the first verses. The final verses use the metaphor of the messianic banquet in the face of enemies. While often used at funerals, it is more to do with trust in God through the days of our lives rather than just through the passage of death.*

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: 1 John 3.16-24

NT p. 223

*The author uses the example of Christ's love and his sacrificial death to discuss the nature of love. The letter is clear that the author argues for people to give their primary attention to God as the God of love and light, and not primarily to their own feelings. Such faith results in confidence, that is, confidence in relating to God, and this then helps us to behave more like Christ, the Good Shepherd.*

Gospel: John 10.11-18

NT p. 96

*On this Fourth Sunday of Easter the gospel lesson shifts from historical recounting of the events following the resurrection to reflection on the nature and efficacy of the Risen Christ. The Risen Christ is the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for the sheep. No cuddly, woolly lambs here, for the image of Shepherd was used of Kings and rulers in biblical times, and this Shepherd is like no other earthly ruler of that time. John's message is this: through Jesus' death, exaltation and return to the Father, a new chapter will open. This Good Shepherd will draw all peoples to himself.*

## VALERIE HUNT

Valerie Hunt was born 15th September 1941 in Wakefield, Yorkshire, UK. She had two sisters, Beryl and Judith.

Val trained as a nurse and midwife. She and Dave married in April 1963. He was in the British Army and had several overseas postings. He was sent to Singapore and enquired if there was any work for his wife at the hospital. The staff could not wait for Val to join the midwifery team! They were posted to Germany and son Adrian arrived. Val returned to Wakefield while Dave had a stint in the Middle East and then back to Berlin where Guy was born. After 25 years in the Army and his retirement, they heard someone from immigration extolling the virtues of South Australia and decided to bring the family to Australia. Travelling by ship, they brought all their goods with them to start a new life.

Val was extremely homesick, but a wise friend advised her to stick it out for two years, as that was how long it would take to get used to her new home. She and Dave became proud Australian Citizens from Yorkshire.

She loved sport, especially Badminton, Keep Fit and Swimming. She was a practise nurse for a Physio friend and later was the Double Certificate member of staff at a nearby Nursing Home at St. Agnes. It was within walking distance and often Dave would walk down with Val's tea, or escort her home after night duty. They supported many elderly friends, particularly those living independently.

She and Dave enjoyed trips overseas, including Europe, UK and New Zealand, as well as friendships made in Lions International and Masonic Lodge, and caravanning to far North Queensland to visit their son Adrian.

We met about 25 years ago at a Citizenship ceremony and they joined St. Andrew's parish in 2003. Theirs was a true partnership in a marriage of more than 54 years. Dave was thought to be in charge of the kitchen with his legendary Eccles cakes. However, Val was the whizz on Yorkshire pudding and from her we learnt that it could be served for breakfast with jam and cream, for dinner with roast beef and as dessert with fruit and custard!

She was delighted with the arrival of the grandchildren, where Val was always quietly involved. Entertaining family and friends round the pool and on the deck were her specialities.

About three years ago, she was diagnosed with early dementia and Parkinson's. It was only when Dave was hospitalized last September, the boys realized how frail their mother was and how much she depended on him. A roster group of family, friends and carers enabled her to stay at home after his death. Her elder sister Beryl visited in February and on the 19<sup>th</sup> Val moved into a Nursing Home. Over Easter she enjoyed visits to family and friends. She passed away in RAH suddenly on Wednesday 4th April. Our English White Rose will be sadly missed. Vale Valerie. *Jennie and Robin Coleman*
