Readings

1st Reading: 1 Samuel 3.1-10 OT p. 231

The call of Samuel the prophet happens at a time in Israel's history where prophecy is not strong but God is still active (v.1). Samuel and Eli take time to realise what God is doing, but with Eli's aged wisdom and Samuel's youthful enthusiasm, they work it out. In the following verses (11-20), Eli will have to bear the criticism from God which Samuel has to find the courage to deliver. After having done so, Samuel will go on to anoint kings and become a powerful prophet in the life of God's people.

Psalm: Psalm 139. 1-6, 13-18 (said)

APBA p. 370

This thanksgiving psalm acknowledges God's intimate knowledge of us. It affirms the comfort and discomfort of the inescapable presence and knowledge of God, praising God for this blessing.

2nd Reading: 2 Corinthians 4.5-12

NT p. 167

It seems that there were people at Corinth who saw the reverses Paul suffered as evidence that he was not an authentic apostle, a true spokesman for Christ. But Paul proclaims Christ rather than himself. He is totally committed to God. God is the one who gives "light", ie. understanding. The "light" shone in Paul's life in his conversion experience. But while we have access to this understanding, we are fragile and weak like "clay pots" – so this amazing power must be from God. But Paul still keeps going, despite setbacks. He realizes in his weakness that he needs the salvation made available through Jesus' death, so that he may be alive in Christ, but he is always prone to failure. God intends that Paul suffer duress, so that the good news may be known.

Gospel: Mark 2.23-3.6

NT p. 34

Pharisees attack Jesus through his disciples for both exceeding the distance a Jew might walk on the sabbath, and for doing work on this day. He answers a question with a question: surely you recall that David broke the Law by eating bread from the altar, and by permitting his companions to do likewise? Human needs are more important than observing the sabbath, so "the Son of Man" has sovereign power.

In Chapter 3 the man's illness is not life-threatening, so healing him on the sabbath would contravene Jewish practice. To Jesus, healing is saving lives, part of God's intervention in the world; to miss an opportunity to restore health is akin to killing. Jesus is angry because the Pharisees, seeking to entrap him, are fixed in their thinking. They conspire with the "Herodians", a secular group, to destroy him: a strange partnership with only one aim in common.
