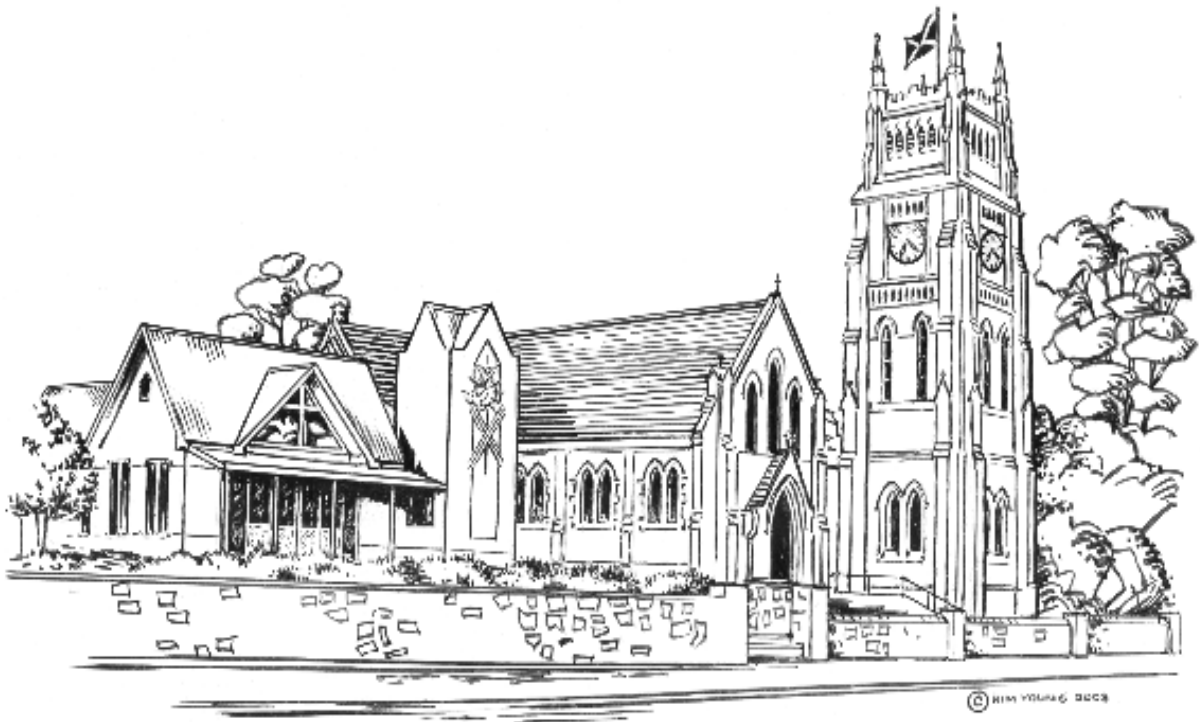

Readings

1st Reading: Song of Songs 3.1-4a

OT p. 570

This book of the Bible is a collection of love poems that celebrate the erotic and sensual between lovers. Ascribed to Solomon, it has caused many debates over the years. It is in the Bible because it was thought an allegory of the relationship between God and the people of Israel, or, for Christians, an allegory of the intimate relationship between Christ and his Church. Chapter 3:1-5 is a soliloquy by the beloved. The choice of this passage for Mary Magdalene's Day connects these words with the intimacy of relationship between Mary Magdalene and Jesus, and therefore, expresses something of our own intimacy with God in prayer.

Psalm: Psalm 63 (*said*)

APBA p. 284

This psalm uses the metaphor of thirsting and longing for God, and the psalmist takes refuge in the place where one is loved and secure, the 'shadow' of God's 'wings.' It is appropriate for Mary Magdalene and her devotion to God. Verses 9–12 appear to exult in violence to others from our 21st century perspective, but in its context, it is an affirmation that when hostility threatens, when loss and grief leave us feeling abandoned, we are led to sing for joy in the shadow of God's wings, as Mary Magdalene does after her encounter with Jesus at the tomb.

2nd Reading: 2 Corinthians 5.14-21

NT p.168

In Luke 8:2 we are told that Jesus had cast seven demons out of Mary Magdalene, her renewal makes this reading from Paul relevant to her and to how Christ's love makes all of us a new creation. Paul knows well times of persecution and opposition but can confidently claim that it does not matter if he sometimes fails or seems weak, for the main thing is to embody Christ's ministry of love.

Gospel: John 20.1-18

NT p. 107

Mary Magdalene is mentioned in the Gospels as being among the women of Galilee who followed Jesus and his disciples, and who was present at his crucifixion and burial, and, in today's Gospel reading, we hear how she went to the tomb on Easter Sunday to anoint his body. Because she was the first to see the risen Lord, and to announce his resurrection to the apostles she is referred to in early Christian writings as "the apostle to the apostles." Her intimate encounter with the risen Jesus, and command not to cling to this material experience, compels her to tell others of the joy of Christ risen.
