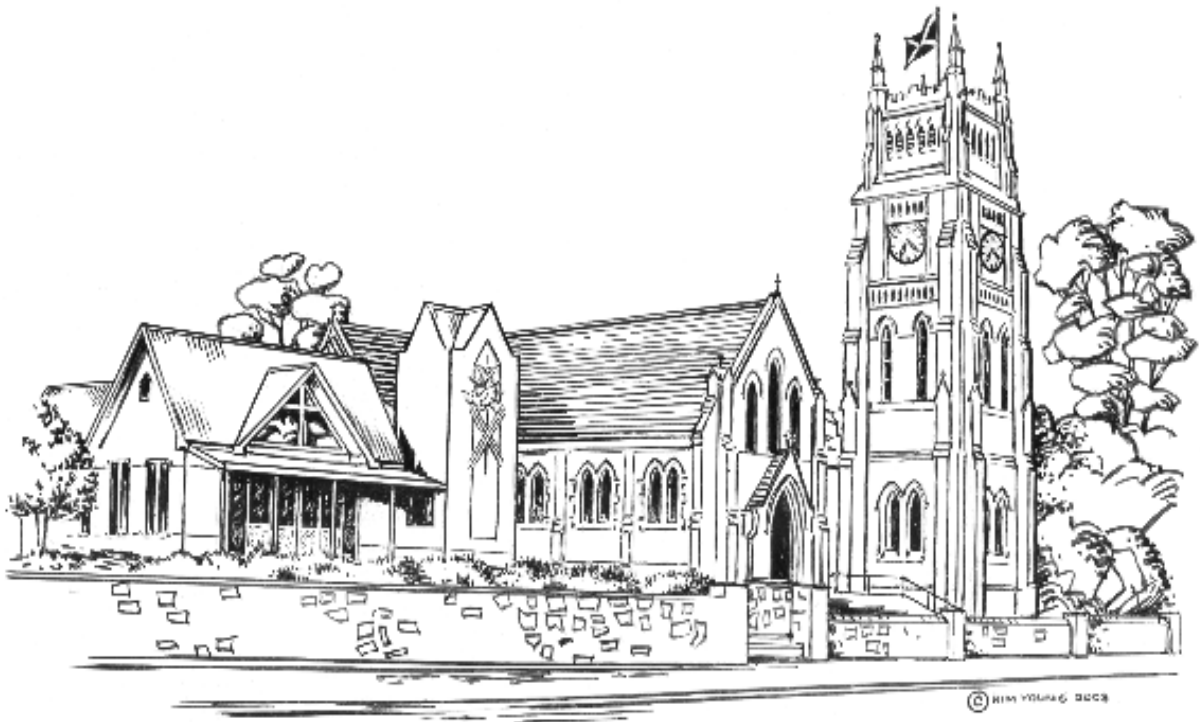

Readings

1st Reading: 2 Samuel 18.5-9, 14, 31-33

OT p. 273

Last week, Nathan the prophet confronted David about his lust for Bathsheba and the subsequent murder of Uriah, and prophesied of the tragedy which would shape the rest of David's life and reign. Since that moment, Absalom, David's third son, has succeeded in leading a rebellion against his father, forcing David to flee Jerusalem. Today we hear of David's successful counter attack but his order for leniency is ignored by his military commander, Joab, who kills Absalom. David poignantly grieves and laments for both his dead son and his sin.

Psalm: Psalm 130 (*said*)

APBA p. 364

This lament is one series of psalms (120-134) identified with the approach of pilgrims to Jerusalem for one of the great religious festivals. Chosen to follow the first reading, it fits David's sorrow, 'from the depths,' over the death of his sons Absalom and Amnon.

2nd Reading: Ephesians 4.25-5.2

NT p. 180

One theme of this letter is 'unity.' But how is it to be achieved? This reading helps the Ephesians understand that inner transformation is not enough. It must lead to a change in outward behaviour; one cannot happen without the other. Greed and anger, selfish living and slander, are to be put aside in favour of imitating Christ.

Gospel: John 6.35, 41-51

NT p. 91

This passage from John continues the 'in-depth' study on Jesus, 'the bread of life,' which follows the miraculous feeding of the crowd of five thousand. Just before these verses, Jesus tells the crowd who have been chasing him since the miracle occurred, that they had missed the point of this sign and just wanted another fill of bread (v.26). To be filled with 'the bread of life' leads to true relationship with God, which is 'eternal life.'
