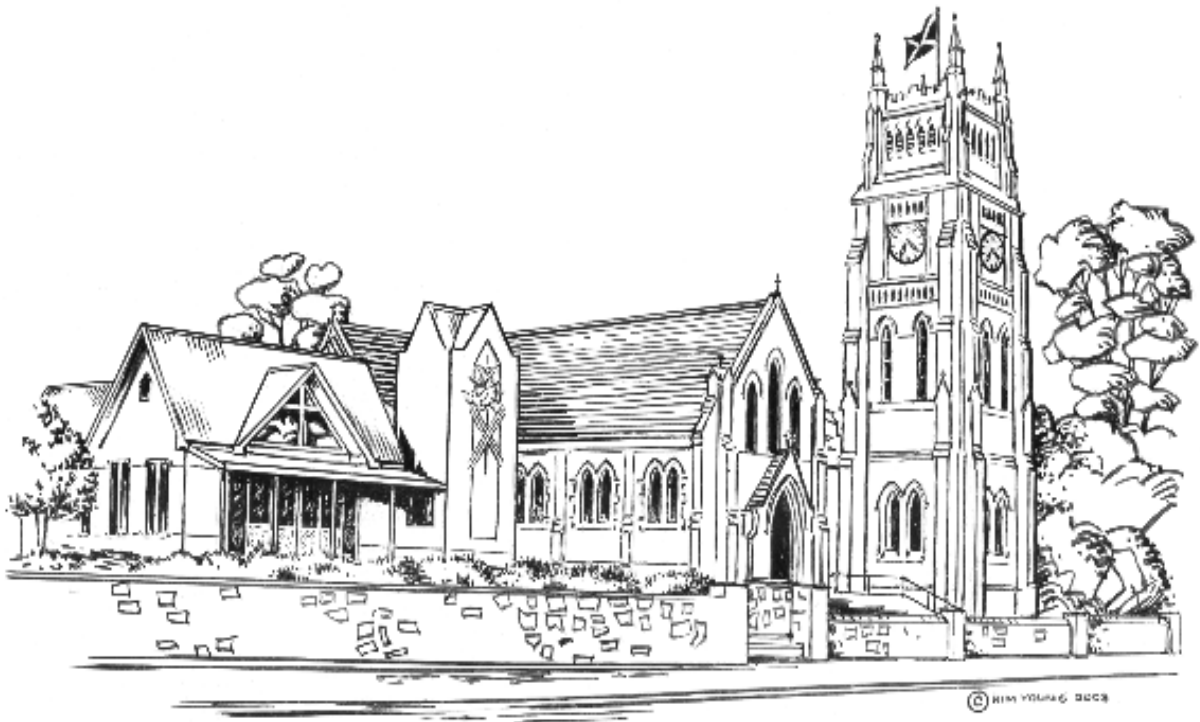

## Readings

1<sup>st</sup> Reading: 1 Kings 2.10-12; 3.3-14

OT p. 284

*David's reign has ended (970 BCE) and Solomon, his son, through a murky political process, becomes his successor. Today's passage tells how God gives Solomon his famed wisdom and that success for Solomon will depend on loyalty to the Lord, the exercise of genuine (divine) wisdom, and a readiness to 'walk in the Lord's ways'.*

Psalm: Ps 111 (*said*)

APBA p. 343

*This thanksgiving psalm is acrostic with each line beginning with one of the 22 letters of the Hebrew alphabet. The psalm ends with 'the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom', likely an old proverb, and connects us with Solomon in the first reading. 'Fear' in this context is not terror but rather worship or awe. That is the starting point for all wisdom, whether we are ruling a nation like Solomon, or just in the humdrum of daily life.*

2nd Reading: Ephesians 5.11-21

NT p. 180

*In the first part of this letter, we are asked to reflect on what we believe about Jesus. In this final section, we are advised about how we are to behave in the light of God's grace, given to us through Jesus Christ. In response, we are urged to live 'wisely,' to let God's Spirit fill us, which helps us thank God and sing God's praise.*

Gospel: John 6.51-58

NT p. 91

*Behind John's Gospel is the author's knowledge that God became a real, live human being in the flesh of Jesus of Nazareth. Today's passage claims that this 'flesh and blood Jesus' is our nourishment in a special way. While "the Jews" (i.e. those Jews who opposed the Jew, Jesus, and did not join with the Jews who were his disciples) interpret Jesus literally and are, therefore, offended, those who receive Holy Communion recognise the symbolism. The real food and drink of Holy Communion speak to us of Christ's presence with us. If Christ is in us, then we live in him and draw life from God the Father through him.*
