

Readings

First Reading: 2 Samuel 6.1-5, 12b-19

OT p. 262

David has now cemented his unifying kingship over both the northern and southern kingdoms. His finishing touch to the newly established capital Jerusalem is to bring to it the Ark of the Covenant with pomp and ceremony. This completes the journey, begun with the Exodus out of Egypt and continued through the wilderness, where the people have relied on God's protection and sustenance. The Ark is the symbol of God's presence.

Psalm 24 (said)

APBA p. 244

This psalm may have been used for a festival, dedication ceremony, or even a re-enactment of the entry of the Lord into his temple. A superscription says it is connected with David, so is a natural link to the entry of the Ark of the Covenant into Jerusalem as told in the first reading.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1.1-14

NT p. 178

For the next seven weeks, this series of New Testament readings will be from Paul's letter to the Christians in Ephesus. Possibly used by the early Church to prepare new converts for baptism at Pentecost, these opening verses begin with a lofty doxology (praise) concerning God the Father and what God has done in Christ.

Gospel: Mark 6.14-29

NT p. 38

The gruesome story of the death of John the Baptist, displays the machinations of power and the structures of injustice which faced those who lived in the time of Jesus and when Mark wrote his Gospel. It is a story of the exploitation of women, citizens and slaves and of the silencing of John the Baptist's cry for justice. It appears here in Mark's narrative to help us, the reader, connect with what is to come: the cross of Christ.

God has spoken (A&M 379)

- 1. God has spoken by his prophets, spoken his unchanging word; each from age to age proclaiming God the one, the righteous Lord; In the world's despair and turmoil one firm anchor holds us fast: God eternal reigns for ever, God the first, and God the last.
- 2. God has spoken by Christ Jesus, Christ, the everlasting Son; brightness of the Father's glory, with the Father, ever one: spoken by the word incarnate, Life, before all time began, Light of Light, to earth descending, God, revealed as Son of Man.
- 3. God is speaking by his Spirit, speaking to our hearts again; in the ageless Word declaring God's own message, now as then. Through the rise and fall of nations one sure faith is holding fast: God abides, his word unchanging, God the first, and God the last.
