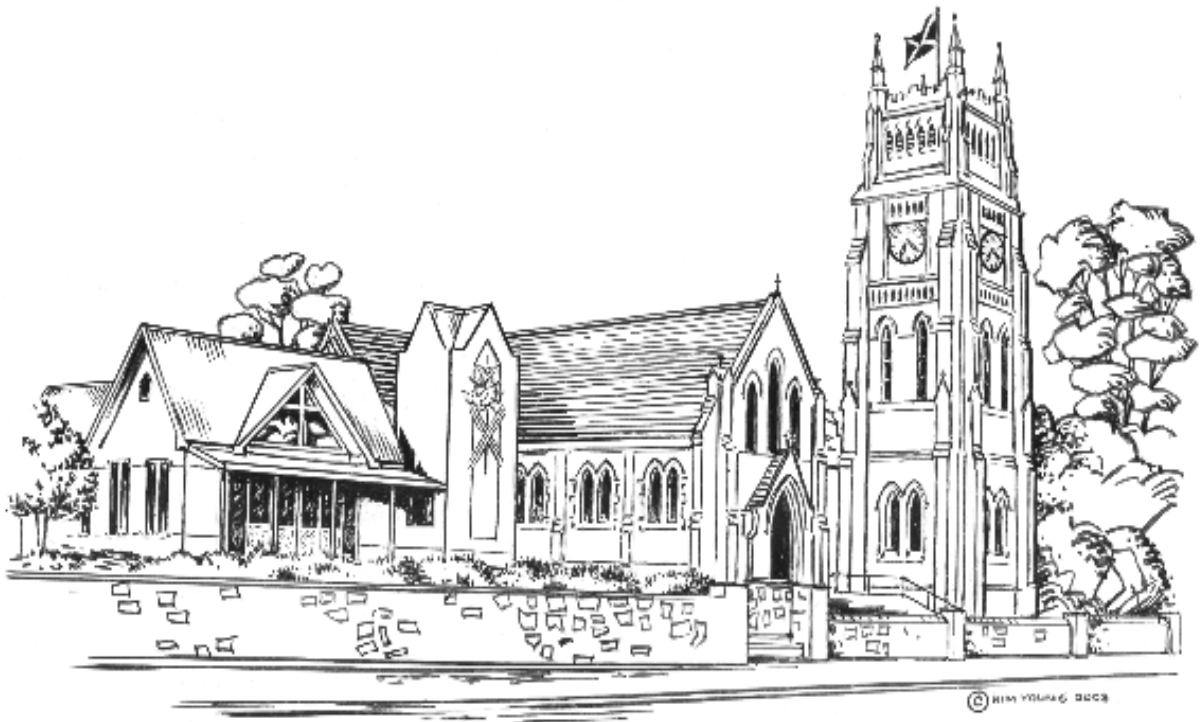

Readings

1st Reading: Proverbs 22.1-2, 8-9, 22-23

OT p. 553

Over the coming weeks, the OT reading will come from a series of books of the Bible that are called Wisdom literature, which includes Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes, the Song of Songs as well as certain Psalms. Wisdom literature is written to help us lead a wise life and draws on the insights and experience of human conduct. Today's selection of verses consists of wise sayings, written in couplets, about how the rich should treat the poor.

Psalm: Psalm 125 (*said*)

APBA p. 361

These verses sound like proverbs themselves only they have been turned into prayers directed toward the Lord and speak of God's protection for the righteous. Mount Zion means the site of the temple in Jerusalem, which is more a hill circled by hills, than a 'Mount' circled by 'mountains.' This poetic focus on the greatness of God, rather than the actual geography, reminds Israel that its security lies in the Lord's protection and that faith is the key response to that.

2nd Reading: James 2.1-10, 14-17

NT p. 212

The book of James is a collection of exhortations, loosely linked together. It stands in the tradition of writings that offer wisdom, writings like the book of Proverbs. Today's passage wants to connect faith with the way we live. It argues that if we say to those in need that 'God is powerful and will surely fulfil their needs,' but then do not do what is in our power to meet their needs, our words about faith become like a worthless corpse.

Gospel: Mark 7.24-37

NT p. 39

There are a number of boundaries being crossed in this encounter between Jesus and the Canaanite Woman (referred to by scholars as the Syrophenician Woman). Barriers based on ethnicity, gender, religion or purity are all overcome because of the faith and determination of this unnamed woman and Jesus' receptivity of her rabbinical approach. The word 'dogs' is a derogatory word for a Gentile, and poses questions as to why it would be on the lips of Jesus. However, the result is this: barriers to the inclusion of Gentiles are dropped, a blind man sees again, and 4000 Gentiles are fed (Mk 8:1-10).
