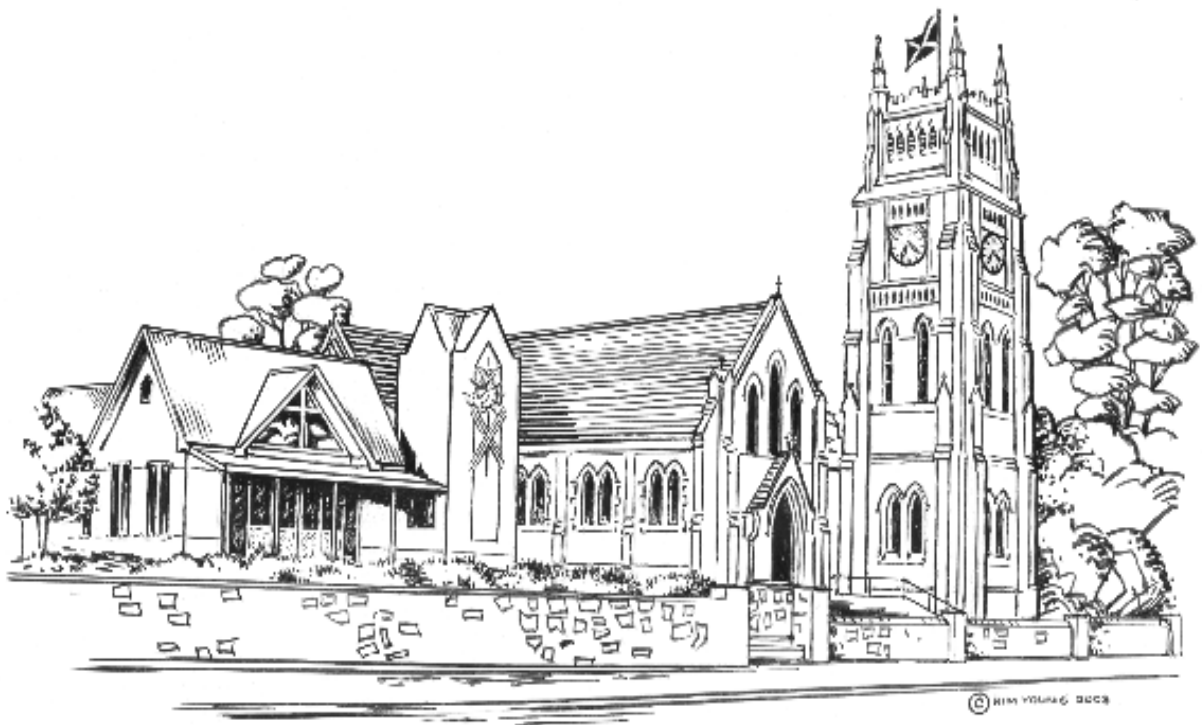

### Readings

1st Reading: Esther 7.1-6, 9-10; 9.20-22

OT p. 418

*This week is the only Sunday in the Calendar when we hear from the Book of Esther. Set in the time of the Persian king Xerxes I (486-485 BCE), the book tells the story of the Jewish woman, Esther (Hadassah in Hebrew) who eventually becomes Queen of Persia and advocates to the king for her life and the lives of her people. In the portion we hear today, Esther reveals Haman's treachery to the King, and he is executed on the gallows Haman*

*had prepared for Mordecai. The Jewish feast of Purim celebrates and remembers the deliverance of the Jews from their enemies.*

Psalm: Psalm 124 (*said*)

APBA p. 361

*This psalm is one of those described as 'The Psalms of Ascents' (Pss 120-134) that may have been used by pilgrims on their pilgrimage to Jerusalem. It thanks God for deliverance from the assaults of some unknown enemy. It could be a military context, but following the reading from Esther, it also applies to a period of persecution or political instability.*

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: James 5.12-20

NT p. 214

*This last chapter (5) focusses on the community responding to suffering: through patient waiting for the 'coming of the Lord' (5:7) and through engaging with the suffering of those who are sick. Anointing with oil and the laying on of hands in prayer are still part of our healing ministry today, recognising that people's 'ill-health' can have physical, moral and spiritual dimensions. Our language expresses the spiritual basis of all healing, health and wholeness; these ordinary English words – healing, health, wholeness and holy – all have a common derivation.*

Gospel: Mark 9.38-50

NT p. 42

*The disciples are indignant about what appears to be an intellectual property dispute. Who has authority to use the name of Jesus? Reasonable, perhaps, but not a view Jesus agrees with. As long as people are being liberated from what oppresses them, that is what matters, and this coheres well with Jesus' teaching elsewhere. Jesus is not an egotist obsessed with protecting his reputation, but someone who cares about people. Care for the most vulnerable arouses the hyperbole of cutting off one's own limbs; as attention grabbing to Jesus' hearers as to the hearers of our own day.*
