

Today in the Diocese is nominated as Anglicare Sunday. Held each year, on the second Sunday in October, Anglicare Sunday provides an opportunity for parishes to focus on the work of Anglicare on a particular day of the year. Of course, parishes often pray for, connect with and support the work of Anglicare across the whole year, but an annual focus can still be a good reminder. St. Andrew's has a strong and healthy connection with Anglicare, and today we welcome its CEO, the Reverend Peter Sandeman as our Preacher at both the 8am and 9.30am services.

Peter will be well known to many of you. Before moving interstate, Peter served as Registrar of the Diocese of Adelaide and before that General Manager (Community Services) of Mission Australia. He then took on the role of Chief Executive of Anglicare NSW South, NSW West and ACT, a multi-service agency focusing on aged care, early education, out-of-home-care, disability services, homelessness services and community development in Canberra and across rural and remote NSW.

Peter has a long history working for social and economic development in South Australia having been variously the Director of Disability Services, Director of Primary Health, the inaugural Director of the Office of the North and established Case Management SA for the Department of Trade and Economic Development. He has been the CEO of Anglicare SA since 2012, the year in which he was also Ordained Deacon in the Diocese of Canberra / Goulburn. We thank Peter for his presence with us today.

Readings

1st Reading: Job 23.1-9; 16-17

OT p. 436

A lot has happened before this week's passage takes up Job's story. Last week we heard how Job was suffering through no fault of his own. In the previous chapters, Job has three 'friends', Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar, who all come and try to link his suffering with sin, and who will be told by God at the end of the book, that they were wrong to do this. Meanwhile, Job's replies are getting shorter and more desperate. Job tells his "friends" that he is earnestly seeking God, to put his argument that his suffering is unjust; but God does not answer and Job is daunted by God's otherness.

Psalm: Psalm 22.1-15

APBA p. 241

This psalm is an ancient lament of a people seeking God in the midst of suffering they cannot explain, and so is a very fitting response to the reading from Job. It is used on Good Friday and from their earliest days, Christians have related it to the death of Jesus. It unusually, moves, to and fro, from feelings of suffering and abandonment by God, to expressions of trust in God.

2nd Reading: Hebrews 4.12-16

NT p. 204

Urging the reader to persevere in their Christian faith, the author shows that God's word is alive and active and can cut to the innermost parts of a person. God's Son understands our weaknesses so we can bravely come to God with our needs knowing that we will be treated with kindness and find help. The word of God is not words in a book, but a living force, opening us to God through Jesus our Saviour to the power of God's grace.

Gospel: Mark 10.17-31

NT p. 43

Mark tells this story of a rich man to put before his readers the true cost of being a disciple of Jesus and the grace found in following Christ. This was an authentic enquiry from a man who led a good life, but was too attached to his wealth. This passage may be difficult for us to hear in our consumer age where wealth and possessions matter so much. Jesus' primary call is a call to a life of discipleship, not necessarily to a life of poverty. His words "come and follow" in 10:21 recall other calls to discipleship (1:16-20; 2:14; 8:34; 15:41), and they stem from his love for the man.

Planned Giving Program 2019/20

Next Sunday, the Planned Giving Program for 2019/20 will be launched. Over the subsequent weeks our focus will be on the gifts that we have been given by God in our lives, and the ways in which we are called and challenged to use those gifts.

On Sunday, 25th November, on Thanksgiving Sunday, you will be asked to indicate your level of financial commitment to the parish for the coming two years. For those who are currently pledging, I urge you to consider whether you are able to increase your giving. For those who are not currently part of this program I pray that you would see this as a way of contributing to the ongoing life and ministry of the parish, and a way of sacrificial giving which is part of our Christian Stewardship.

Your pledge is, in many ways, something between you and God. From a practical perspective, only the Parish Recorder (Allan Edgar will take over from Michael Thomas in this role from December) retains the information about who has pledged what amount. This information is not shared with Parish Council, Wardens, or the Rector. The amounts that are pledged are given to the Treasurer, in order that a budget can be prepared, but the names attached to the pledge are removed at that point – you can be sure that your privacy is safeguarded in this regard.

You will also be encouraged over the coming weeks to consider whether there are other ways that you may assist the church – by becoming part of a roster of readers, servers, sidespeople, flower arrangers, and a myriad of other opportunities. The life of the parish will be enhanced by more people's involvement at every level, and I do ask you to think about what it is you can offer.

On Thanksgiving Sunday we will also acknowledge the blessings that we receive in our lives, by bringing perishable and non-perishable food items to donate to those less fortunate than ourselves. More information will follow regarding this. May God continue to bless this parish and its ministry.
