

Readings

1st Reading: Job 38.1-7

OT p. 447

When Job has nothing more to say, and has exhausted his plea for God to answer his questions and vindicate him, finally, God answers out of the whirlwind. Instead of answering Job's questions, or vindicating him, God asks if Job was there at the beginning of the world. This takes the focus away from Job's life and suffering, to the bigger picture of God's creation where God's sustaining spirit under-girds everything.

Psalm: Psalm 104.1-10, 26 (sung)

This psalm praises the Creator and the work of God in Creation. It expresses the power and awesome splendour, which matches God's speech from the whirlwind that we heard in the first reading from Job.

2nd Reading: Hebrews 5.1-10

NT p. 204

The High Priest in the Jewish Temple of Jesus' day, offered up a sacrifice for the sins of the people. The author comforts the Jewish members of his community by arguing that Jesus is a greater High Priest than the priests they had lost when the Temple was destroyed. Unlike the overwhelming and distant God in the face of Job's personal concerns, Jesus Christ comes as High Priest, to overcome that distance and take human suffering into the heart of the creator.

Gospel: Mark 10.35-45

NT p. 43

James and John request the places of honour in Jesus' Kingdom, little knowing what they are asking for. Jesus challenges them to rethink their status and ambition, for in the Kingdom of God, greatness equates with service. And being a servant in the Kingdom is not about subservience to Jesus, but about joining him, the servant of all. This passage is not only about what it means to be great, but it is also about God's character: the God who creates all that is, is the one full of love, compassion and self-giving.
