

## Readings

1st Reading: Deuteronomy 32.1-4


OT p.177

*There is a legend that Simon and Jude went together to preach the Gospel in Persia, which may explain why nothing is known of them. However, in the absence of evidence, all that is known is that they were apostles, and therefore, were sent by Jesus to spread the word of God. At the end of Deuteronomy, we find Moses, an old man, giving his final encouragement to obey the covenant. Today's words are part of Moses' song which poetically celebrates that God's word will be proclaimed with joy, the same task which Simon and Jude were called to do.*

Psalm: Psalm 19.1-6 (sung)

*This psalm rejoices in the glory of Creation and of God's gift of the Torah (or law) which Christians might interpret as following the way of Jesus. Both can lead to "the fear of the Lord," which means, the awe and worship of God in all God's glory.*

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Jude 1-3, 17-25

NT p. 226

*The author of the letter of Jude, may or may not be the same person, as "Judas son of James" but as the letter was attributed to him, we commemorate the author on this day too. It is written to warn Christians against those who are causing division in the community. We hear from the later verses which conclude with a beautiful and moving doxology.*

Gospel: Luke 6.12-16

NT p. 59

*The Feast of Simon and Jude celebrates the lives of two of the Apostles about whom very little is known. They occupy the tenth and eleventh places in the lists of the Apostles found in three of the Gospels. The passage today has the list of the Apostles from Luke, who calls them "Simon the Zealot" and "Jude, son of James;" and Mark and Matthew call them, "Simon the Cananean" and "Thaddeus." Except for these lists, Simon is not mentioned elsewhere in the New Testament. Josephus, the ancient historian, describes a Jewish independent movement called the "Zealots" but it is thought unlikely Simon was one. Rather, he just may have been a zealous person. The many names for Judas (Jude in English) is not surprising as he needed distinguishing from Judas Iscariot, the betrayer. Along with the letter attributed to him, Jude is mentioned in John's Gospel.*

## Planned Giving & Stewardship

Our Planned Giving Program was launched last week, and I sincerely encourage you all to be thinking seriously about your response to this. As well as our giving, over the next few weeks I will focus on other areas of our life to which we are called to pay attention. Today the focus is on **prayer**

Prayer is the power-house of the church. Without prayer, nothing can be achieved or sustained. Many things have been brought about by prayer through the ages. But it is not a matter of just praying and leaving it at that. Prayer can be the opportunity where we speak to God, and then God responds to us. God responds to inspire us, give us wisdom and discernment, enable us to think and act, provide opportunities, and to enable us to experience the grace, goodness and wholeness of God in our lives and in our world. Indeed God gives us enormous opportunities, most of which we often miss because we are distracted by other things. It is only through prayer that we can discern the opportunities that God is giving to each of us.

In our worship liturgy for our weekly Eucharist, there are many forms of prayer – adoration, confession, intercession, contemplation (for those who leave room for silence), petition, and thanksgiving. We are called to exercise these aspects of prayer when we gather together for worship, as well as in our own daily private prayer and quiet time.

Today and over the coming week, reflect upon the amount of time and importance you devote to prayer and make a decision about your future commitment to prayer.
