

The calamities that Jeremiah prophesied (c. 6th century BCE) have now happened; the city of Jerusalem is under siege by the Babylonian king

Nebuchadrezzar and the people will shortly go into exile. Today's reading now speaks of a distant future where God will do what Judah and Israel did not. The promise is for new life to spring up from the dead stump of David's line and righteousness and justice will flourish. Jesus, the Messiah, the descendant of David, the Righteous One, has come and, in Advent, is the one upon whom we wait.



Paul uses the idea from Deuteronomy that the law is not an external and distant set of rules, but is close to us, on 'our lips' and 'in our hearts'. So it is with faith in Christ, argues Paul, which transforms us into messengers of good news.
