Readings

1st Reading: 1 Samuel 2.18-20, 26

OT p.230

Samuel will be one of the great prophets of Israel and will renew the relationship between the people and God. God ends Hannah's barrenness with the gift of a son (Samuel) whom she dedicates to God. Today's reading is poignant because Hannah puts all her love into the robe and ephod which her only son will wear as he serves God at the shrine of Shiloh.

Psalm: Psalm 148 (said)

APBA p.378

This psalm is one of five praise songs that conclude the book of psalms, each beginning and ending with 'Hallelujah' meaning 'praise God.' The psalm is in two parts: verses 1–6 call on the heavens to praise God, while 7–13 calls forth praise from the earth. The final two verses give the reason for the people's praise of God: the Lord is near them.

2nd Reading: Colossians 3.12-17

NT p.187

Paul understands that the Colossians are so loved by God, that the series of exhortations in this passage are helping them understand what the consequences of that love will be. Paul is not saying "be good," but rather, because they are risen in Christ, "God's chosen ones, holy and beloved," from this will flow forgiveness and peace. And they must nourish this love with the word of Christ and the praise of God in worship and song.

Gospel: Luke 2.41-52

NT p.55

This very human story is the only one from the life of Christ that is neither about his birth or adult ministry. Luke is drawing on the story of the growth of Samuel under Eli's tutelage, helping to clarify for his readers that Jesus was a very human person, but with unusual spiritual insight and understanding.
