Readings

1st Reading: Nehemiah 8.1-3, 5-6, 8-10

OT p. 407

*Nehemiah was governor of Judah and was responsible for rebuilding
Jerusalem after the exiles had returned. Today's reading occurs when the
walls of Jerusalem were finished. The proclamation of the Law (the Torah)
reminded the people of their covenant relationship with God and that their
relationship with God still needed rebuilding.*

Psalm: Ps 19 (said together)

APBA p. 239

*In the same way as the people responded to hearing the Law read by Ezra,
so the psalmist responds to God's wisdom, seen first in creation, then in
the written word of the Law. The psalmist responds with a renewed and
repentant heart and mind.*

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 12.12-31

NT p. 161

Christians in Corinth had a variety of spiritual gifts or charisms, the special powers named in last Sunday's reading. Paul wants each to use his or her gifts generously, for the benefit of the whole community. So he compares the individuals in the church to the parts of a single body.

Gospel: Luke 4.14-21

NT p. 57

Having described Jesus' birth and growing up, Luke turns to how Jesus began his ministry. The beginning of Jesus' ministry in Mark's Gospel has Jesus proclaiming the nearness of the Kingdom; in Matthew's Gospel, Jesus delivers the Sermon on the Mount. Here in Luke, Jesus' ministry starts in his home town synagogue quoting from Isaiah about the Spirit anointing him to liberate the oppressed and the poor. This mission of Jesus is therefore our mission, to bring Good News to the poor and oppressed.
