The psalmist expresses youthful trust in God which fits the context of Isaiah's call.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 15.1-11

NT p.161

Paul's credibility was under attack from members of the Church in Corinth. Here he responds by reminding his readers that he passed on to them the faith he had received. He declares himself to be part of the authority of the Apostles even though he is the least of them.

Gospel: Luke 5.1-11

NT p.58

Like Isaiah's experience of God's call, Peter too is filled with inadequacy when he is called by Jesus. Luke's account of the call of the disciples emphasises that it is the presence of Jesus that will transform God's future harvest just as Jesus' presence transformed the disciple's fishing.
