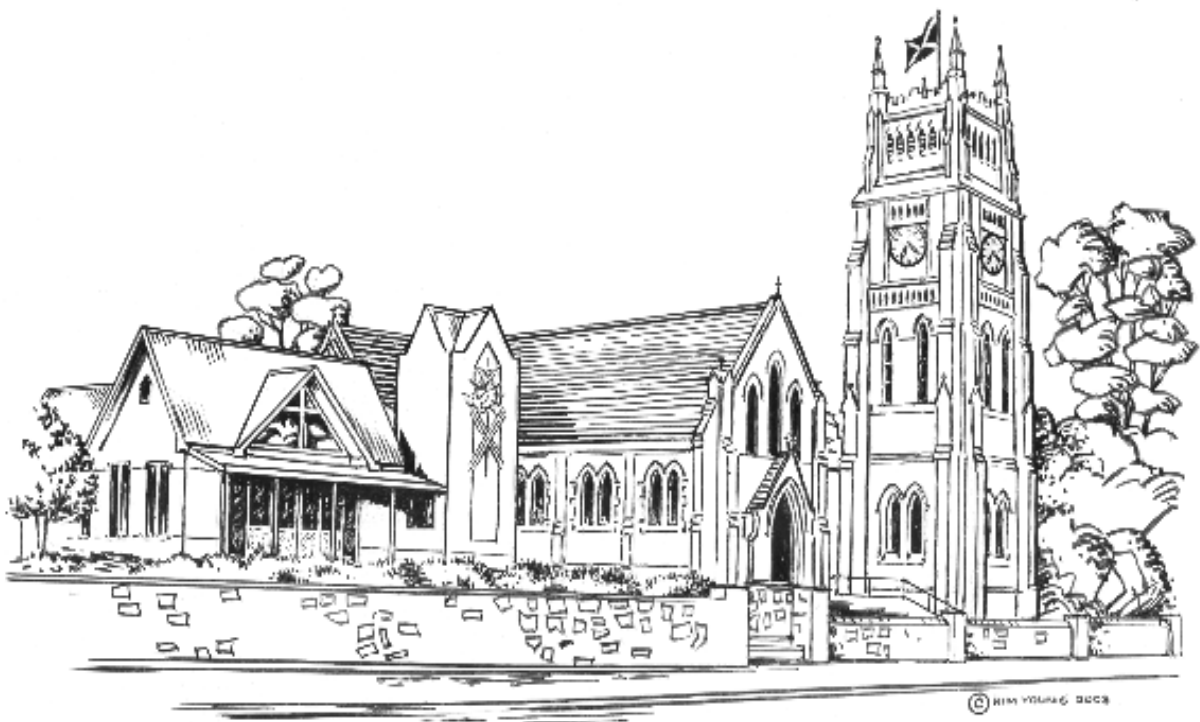

Readings

1st Reading: Isaiah 55.1-9

OT p. 623

This invitation to a banquet, is spoken to a people at the end of their Babylonian captivity in the 6th century BCE, when they were returning from enslavement far away, to a devastated homeland. The words were meant to give them hope and to keep them from losing faith in God. All one needs to accept the invitation is a spiritual thirst.

Psalm: Ps 63.1-9 (*said together*)

APBA p. 284

Here the psalmist expresses confidence and trust in God. It is full of metaphors of eating, drinking and feasting, so it helps us respond positively to the invitation offered by God in the Isaiah reading.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 10.1-13

NT p. 159

Paul warns any self-satisfied Christian that even though God met the needs of the Israelites under Moses, many proved faithless. Paul warns the Christians in Corinth of the danger of having similar spiritual pride.

Gospel: Luke 13.31-35

NT p.71

Jesus does not heed the warning that Herod is out to kill him, even though he knows that Jerusalem will be where he will meet his fate. Like the prophets before him, Jesus will proclaim God's life-giving message even in the face of death.
