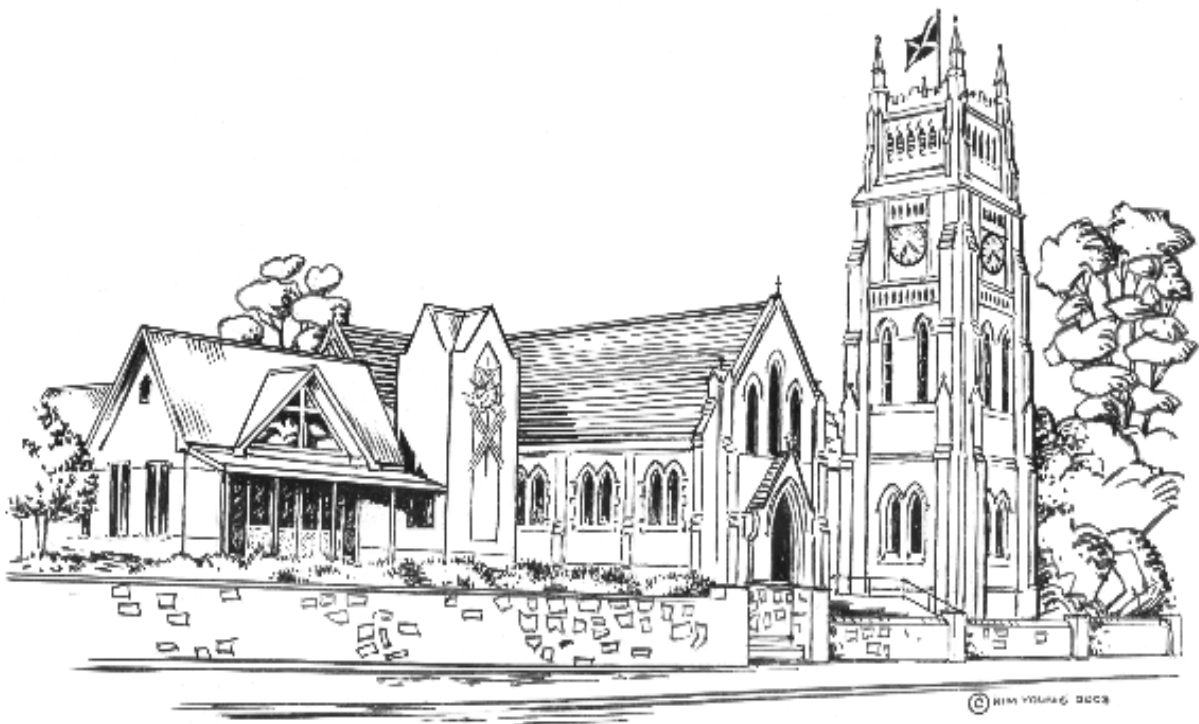

Readings

1st Reading: Isaiah 43.16-21

OT p. 612

In 587 BCE the people of Judah were exiled in Babylon and chapters 40 to 55 of Isaiah are written as their exile was about to end. Through Isaiah's words, God encouraged the people to not give up hope. God is about to help the people return to their home, even though they forgot God before the exile. God will do a 'new thing' and return them to the Promised Land, the same God who defeated the Egyptian army at the Exodus and rescued their ancestors.

Psalm: Psalm 126 (said)

APBA p. 362

Like the reading from Isaiah, this psalm speaks of the hope for deliverance, based on God's past deliverance. Therefore, even if times are difficult and the prospect of success seems remote, God has turned their fortunes in past, and the unlikely will happen again, because God is great.

2nd Reading: Philippians 3.3-14

NT p. 184

Paul was criticised for not following the Hebrew law more precisely. This passage begins with his response to them, by listing his credentials as a Hebrew, which are indeed impressive. But as impressive as his credentials are, he counts them as nothing when compared to the freedom he discovered by following Christ and being transformed by Christ's love.

Gospel Reading: John 12.1-8

NT p. 98

All four gospels mention this story though each gospel has a different emphasis. The allusions to Jesus' burial are strong, but the emphasis is not on the waste of perfume, but the devotion of the woman. Her response is in contrast not just to Judas who betrays Jesus, but also to Peter and the disciples who worry about their position and status.
