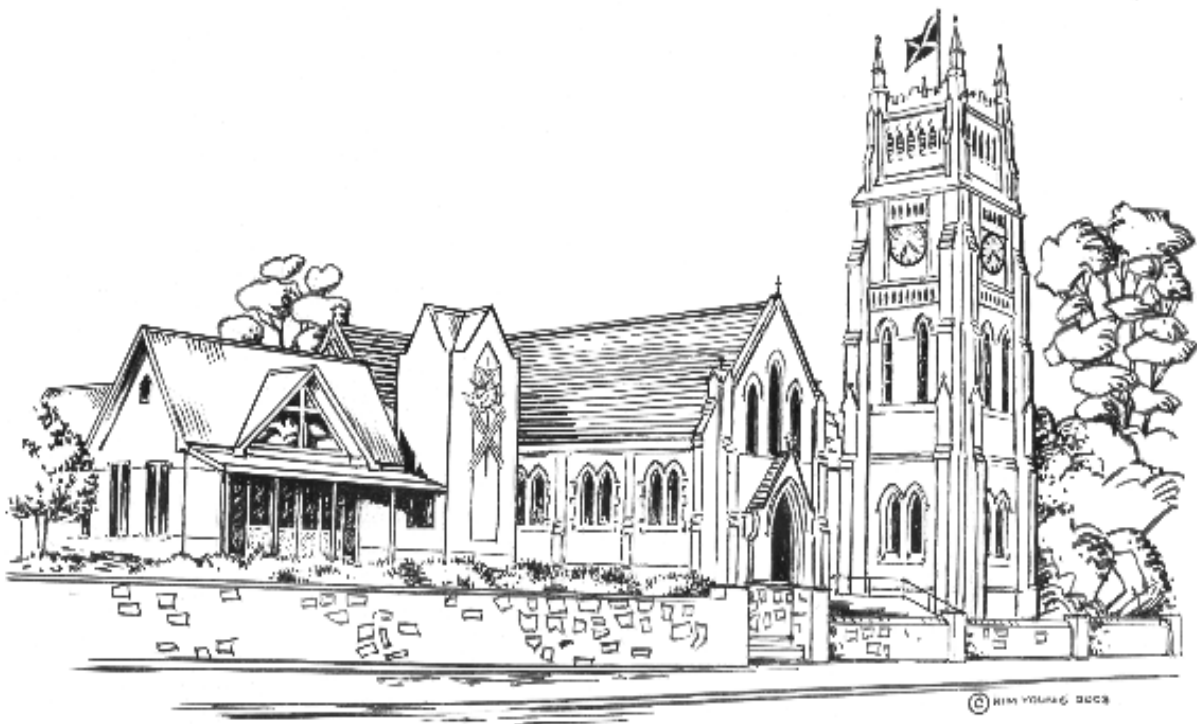

### Readings

1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Acts 9.36-43

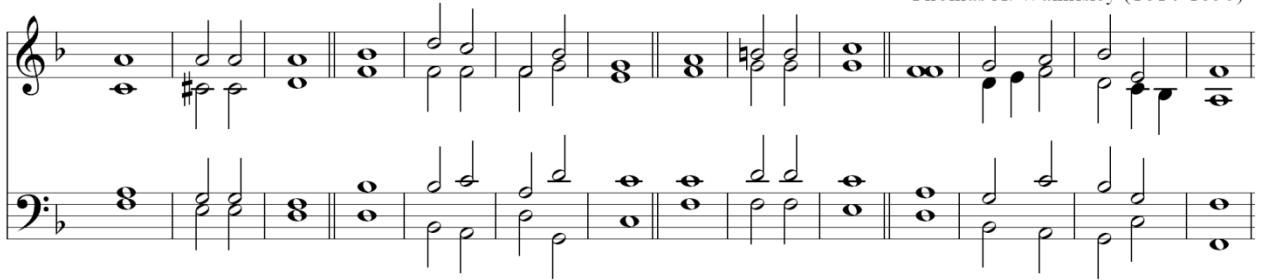
NT p. 119

*Luke, the author of Acts, tells this story of Peter healing Dorcas, to show how Peter is continuing the work of the Good Shepherd, Jesus. This story is shaped by Luke to reflect similar stories in the Gospels, which in turn are similar to stories told about Elijah and Elisha in the OT. All these stories symbolise hope, and the good news God wants to bring: life where there is death, love where there is hate, healing where there is brokenness.*

## Psalm: Psalm 23

*This best loved and most well-known psalm depicts God as a caring and gracious shepherd of the flock. The Kings of Israel, the 'anointed ones' were expected to be shepherds, and perhaps David's perspective is the context here. While often used in the context of death, this psalm is an affirmation of a God who protects and guides his flock from beginning to end.*

2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Revelation 7.9-17

NT p. 231

*Writing to the persecuted Church, the author of Revelation writes in code using metaphors and symbolic language to encourage Christians to reject the despotic rulers they suffer from and remain focussed on God's loving reign. This vision of heaven uses references from Psalm 97, Ezekiel 34:23 and Isaiah 25:8; the martyrs have kept their faith, even to death, and now worship and celebrate before the lamb of God, the victorious shepherd of the people of God.*

Gospel: John 10.22-30

NT p. 96

*Jesus is confronted about his status as Messiah. To such a loaded term implying power and militarism, Jesus points to his actions, not his teaching. Jesus' leadership is one of being a Shepherd to the people, not a tyrant. The community that produced John's Gospel understand that to eyes that can see we recognise God in the story of Jesus and all who hear the voice of God, there and wherever, are God's sheep.*
