Readings

1st Reading: Isaiah 49.1-7

OT p. 617

This servant was initially summoned to reconstitute the remnant of the Israelite exiles, but Isaiah suddenly realizes that such a task is too small, too trivial. No, this servant will now be sent as a 'light to the nations,' in order that God's 'salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.'

Psalm: Psalm 40.1-14 (said)

APBA p. 262

Waiting for the Lord was the theme of Advent. At Christmas we celebrated the coming of the Lord in Jesus. Now in Epiphany that coming is further revealed for what it is and means. Psalm 40 explores something of the nature of the waiting we experienced in Advent. The psalmist's waiting, which the translation describes as 'patient', could equally be seen as intense or over a lengthy period. Now it has come to an end and the psalm speaks of its outcome and the proper response at its conclusion.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 1.1-9

NT p. 153

Today's passage is a hopeful one that emphasizes God's call and provision, and assumes that it is possible to live a sanctified life in the middle of an unsanctified culture. This is a good message for the season of Epiphany, in which we celebrate the revealing of Christ to the world.

Gospel: John 1.29-42

NT p. 85

John acclaim Jesus as "Lamb of God", recognizing that Jesus ranks before him and existed before him. He says: I didn't recognize him as Messiah, but the coming of the Spirit showed me that Jesus is the one chosen by God. I am convinced that he is, and I have told others. Two of John's disciples begin to follow Jesus. First, they are curious about Jesus when John tells them who he is. They follow him, recognizing that he is an authority. Jesus invites them to investigate what he teaches: the two begin to understand the way of life Jesus offers and expects.

dwells in a single life for our beholding:
eternal glory in a human face.
3. Faith overcomes! In Jesus God is teaching,
healing, forgiving, loving to the end;
to all who know him not his arms outreaching
from Calvary's cross, our Shepherd and our Friend.
4. Faith overcomes! The life of Christ abundant,
spent and exhausted in the hour of death,
bursts from the tomb in mystery triumphant,
makes us alive through his own Spirit's breath.
5. Faith overcomes! Christ's witnesses have spoken:
we have not seen, yet now we dare believe
in him is freedom, peace and joy unbroken,
a gift to share with all who will receive.
6. Faith overcomes! In Jesus' love abiding,
we yield ourselves to follow his commands,
willing to suffer for his name, confiding
our needs and hopes and fears into his hands.
