Readings

1st Reading: Isaiah 9.1-4

OT p. 581

*These words are quoted by Matthew's Gospel to identify Jesus as the
promised Davidic Messiah-King. In Isaiah's context, this oracle refers to a
new king in whom is centred hope for a new future, a king who will reverse
the period of devastation Israel and Judah have endured. The Day of
Midian refers to the time when Gideon, who, with just a few Israelites,
unexpectedly defeated a host of enemies.*

Psalm: Psalm 27.1-10 (said)

APBA p. 246

*The context of this psalm is one of difficulty, fear and war. Yet, in the midst
of this context, the psalmist affirms trust and faith in God.*

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 1.10-18

NT p. 153

Paul is very concerned about the disunity in the Church in Corinth, each faction claiming allegiance to its first Christian teacher, or to a particular apostle. Paul wants them to rise above these immature rivalries.

Gospel: Matthew 4.12-25

NT p. 3

Matthew makes use of and adapts words from Isaiah 9 to emphasise that the ministry of Jesus is to both Jews and Gentiles. The town of Nazareth, Jesus' home town, is located in the region of Naphtali and Zebulun, the area mentioned by Isaiah. This largely gentile area is the first to see the light of Christ.
