Psalm: Ps 112 APBA p. 344

Psalm 112 is another acrostic psalm, where its twenty two lines begin with the successive letters of the Hebrew alphabet. Like its companion psalms, Psalms 111 and 113, Psalm 112 begins with 'Praise the Lord!' The psalmist proclaims that a person is blessed when that person demonstrates in their actions, the same compassion and love for justice that God has.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 2.1-13 NT p.154

The Roman culture of Paul's time valued eloquence and ambition, and the leaders of the church in Corinth criticise Paul for his lack of both. He confronts them with the crucified Christ who came to serve; a secret and hidden wisdom. To leave power and control behind and to be ready to serve, is what it means to have the 'mind of Christ.'

Gospel: Matthew 5.13-20 NT p.4

This week continues the 'Sermon on the Mount' from Matthew's gospel. Directed to his disciples, Jesus calls them to be salt and light. Usually salt is interpreted as a preservative, but in the Greek language it may mean the ancient practise of using salt as a fertiliser. To be light and salt is to be used to help grow the kingdom of God.
