A special welcome to all who are worshipping with us for the first time or visiting us today. Please join us for a cup of tea/coffee after the 9.30 am service.

In the Church's calendar, we have entered the special season of Lent. Lent is the season of 40 days before Easter beginning on Ash Wednesday (Feb 26th). It arose out of preparing new Christians for baptism on Easter Day. It is a time of preparation and reflection, and calls every member of the Church to give some time to prayer, study of the Bible and greater generosity to those in need. The aim is to give our relationship with God some greater priority so we create an opportunity for spiritual growth. Our worship, therefore, is a little more sombre and reflective, in contrast to the joy and praise of Easter.

Readings

1st Reading: Genesis 2.15-17, 3.1-7


OT p. 2

As we begin Lent, the readings turn to the question of our capacity to turn away from God. This passage is from the second of two accounts of creation found in chapters 1 to 3 and deals with what is distinctive about our humanity, the ability to choose between good and evil and our propensity to abuse our freedom by choosing to go that one step farther to be like God. Today's verses tell of the moment of disobedience, and we shouldn't miss the story teller's humour of Adam & Eve realising their nakedness.

Psalm: Psalm 32

This psalm has verses of lament and is described as a penitential psalm, but the psalm moves from lament to renewed trust to calling the community to rejoice. It mimics the penitential journey of Lent that ends in the rejoicing of the people of God at Easter.

2nd Reading: Romans 5.12-21

NT p.143

Here Paul described the universal sinfulness of humanity in terms of the myth of the disobedience Adam and Eve as we read in Genesis 2 - 3. And then he gave God's antidote: the free gift of forgiveness that makes us right with God (justification) through the obedience of Jesus Christ in his self-sacrificing life and death which were affirmed by God in the resurrection and exaltation.

Gospel: Matthew 4.1-11

NT p. 3

As we begin Lent, so this reading takes us to Jesus' preparation for his ministry on earth. The temptations put before Jesus by Satan are not moral ones but vocational temptations, and do not come by having evil thoughts but through Satan's use of scripture. Here, at the beginning of Jesus' ministry to Israel, Jesus contends with what kind of Messiah he will be. He withstands the temptation to manipulate others through sensationalism, materialism or political domination.
