

Work required:

The works include the removal and refurbishment of the bells; restoration and maintenance of the clock mechanism, and a major restoration and improvement of the inside of the bell-tower, including modernising access to the ringing chamber, clock winding chamber, belfry, and roof.

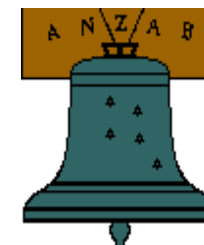

About the Church and Bell Tower:

Since 1848 there has been a church building on this site. The first building was simply a nave (the body of the church) with a small tower over the front door. There remains only a painting of this building.

Then in 1857 the Sanctuary and the two transepts (the side “arms” of the church) were built. Then in 1879 the original nave and tower were demolished and the current nave was built. These buildings have inspired and served the people in Walkerville for over 170 years.

The Bell-Tower was built in 1886 with Tapley’s Hill sandstone and brick dressings, at a cost of £884. The architect was Frank Naish. Its dimensions are 3.7m² internally, with walls 1.2m thick at the base and height 21.3m.

It was built with amazing speed in only 5 months. The Tower is the main feature of the coat of arms of the Corporation of the Town of Walkerville.

A peal of six bells, in the key of F#, with a total weight of approximately 2563kg was shipped by sailing vessel from Mears and Stainbank of Whitechapel U.K. in 1886 and installed that year, the same year as the tower was completed. Each bell is mounted on a wooden headstock and each bell is rung individually by six trained bellringers by means of a wooden wheel and rope.

Each bell swings through a full circle every time it chimes. Over the years many faithful bellringers have rung the bells for Sunday services, weddings, funerals and other special occasions.

The clock was also installed in 1886 and uses three of the bells in its striking mechanism. The clock is still wound by hand each week. It was manufactured by J.W. Benson of Ludgate Hill, London, and installed at a cost of £200 as a gift of Mrs. Hughes in memory of her husband Henry Kent Hughes.

Money was available only for two clock faces overlooking the then development of the village. The third clock face was to be installed “when development to the north warranted it”.
