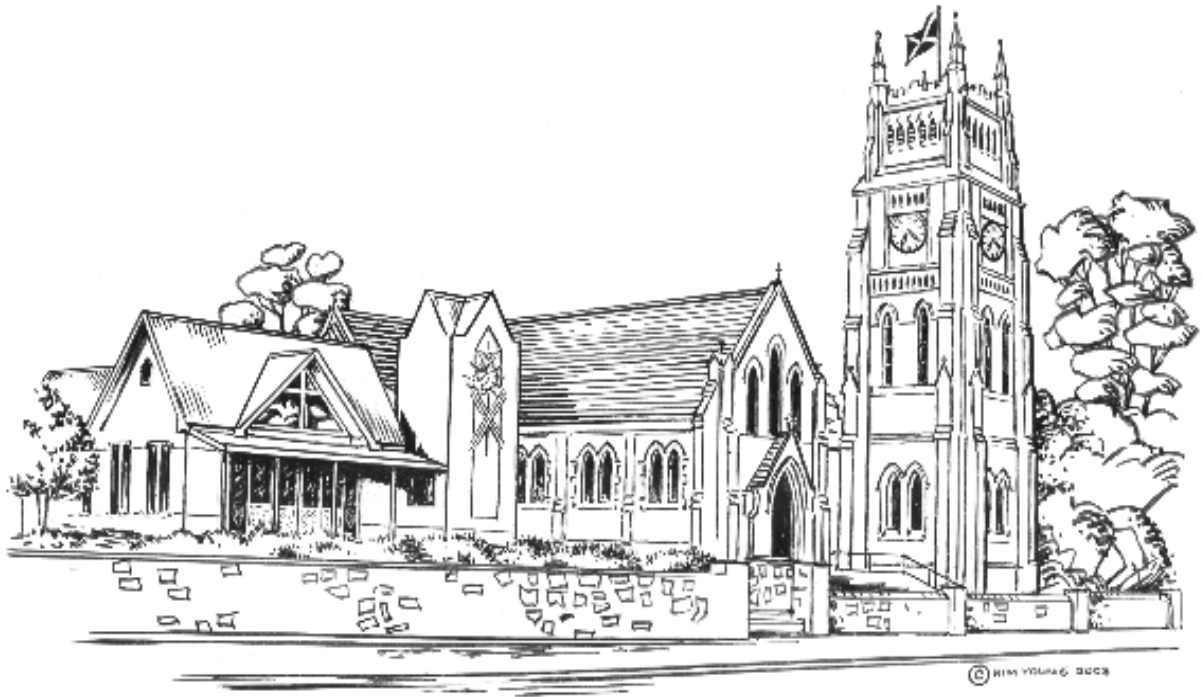

In the Parish

- ❖ **Shrove Tuesday:** Shrove Tuesday occurs on the day before Ash Wednesday. It takes its name from the old word “shriving”, which means to listen to someone’s confession of their sins and forgive them. In Anglo-Saxon England, Christians would go to church on Shrove Tuesday to confess their sins and clean their souls. In other words, they would be “shriven”.

That particular Tuesday has also come to be known as “Pancake Tuesday”. During the season of Lent, Christians would give up eating rich food such as butter, eggs, sugar and fat. Shrove Tuesday was the last chance to eat them – and what better way to do that than with delicious pancakes?

In other countries, Shrove Tuesday has different names. In Germany, it is Fastnacht (‘The Eve of the Fast’). In France it is called Mardi Gras (‘Fat Tuesday’) and has become a day for partying before the solemn season of Lent.

This year, Shrove Tuesday falls on Tuesday 13th February. We shall observe it at St Andrew’s with a pancake lunch starting at 12 noon. Please add your name to the attendance sheet at the back of the church.
