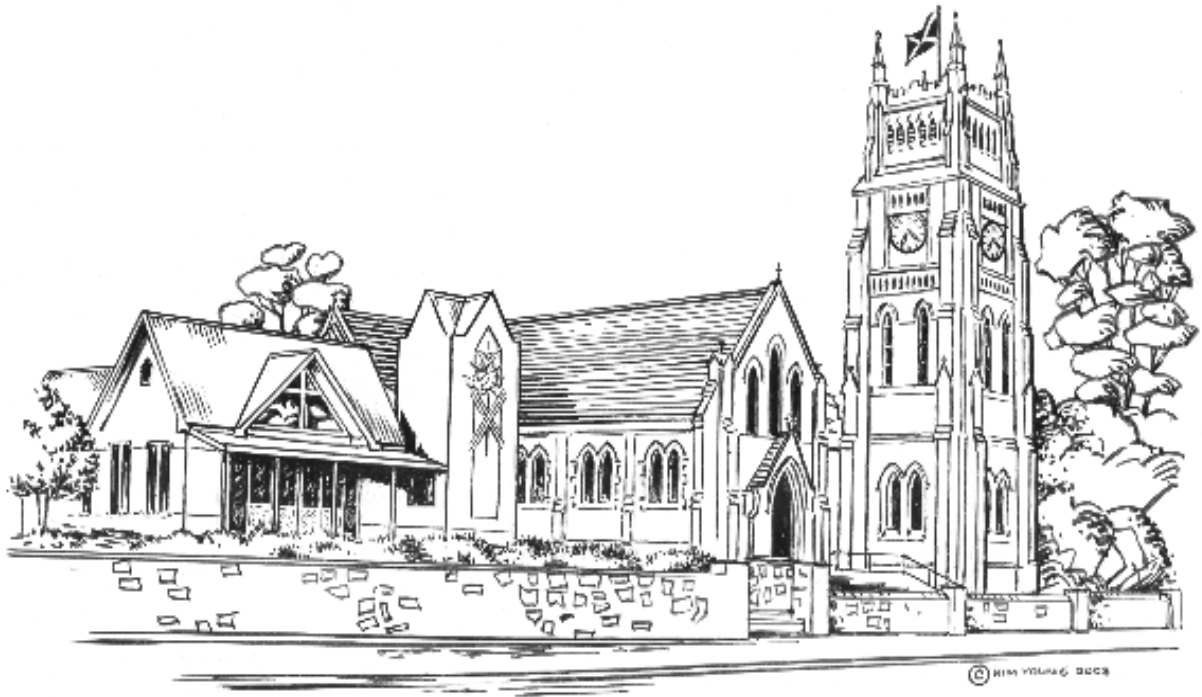

*Affirmation of Faith (please stand)*

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church.

**We believe in one God,  
the Father, the almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,

was incarnate of the Holy Spirit

may be strengthened by Christ's body and blood  
to serve you in the world.

As one body and one holy people,  
may we proclaim the everlasting gospel  
of Jesus Christ our Lord,  
through whom, with whom, and in whom,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
all glory is yours, eternal God, now and for ever: *(sung at 9.30am)*

**Blessing and honour, glory and power,  
are yours for ever and ever, Amen.**

Bless-ing and hon-our and glo-ry and pow'r are yours for  
ev-er and ev-er.  
A-men.

*If you wish to receive the Ministry of Healing, please proceed to the foyer when you have received the Holy Communion.*
