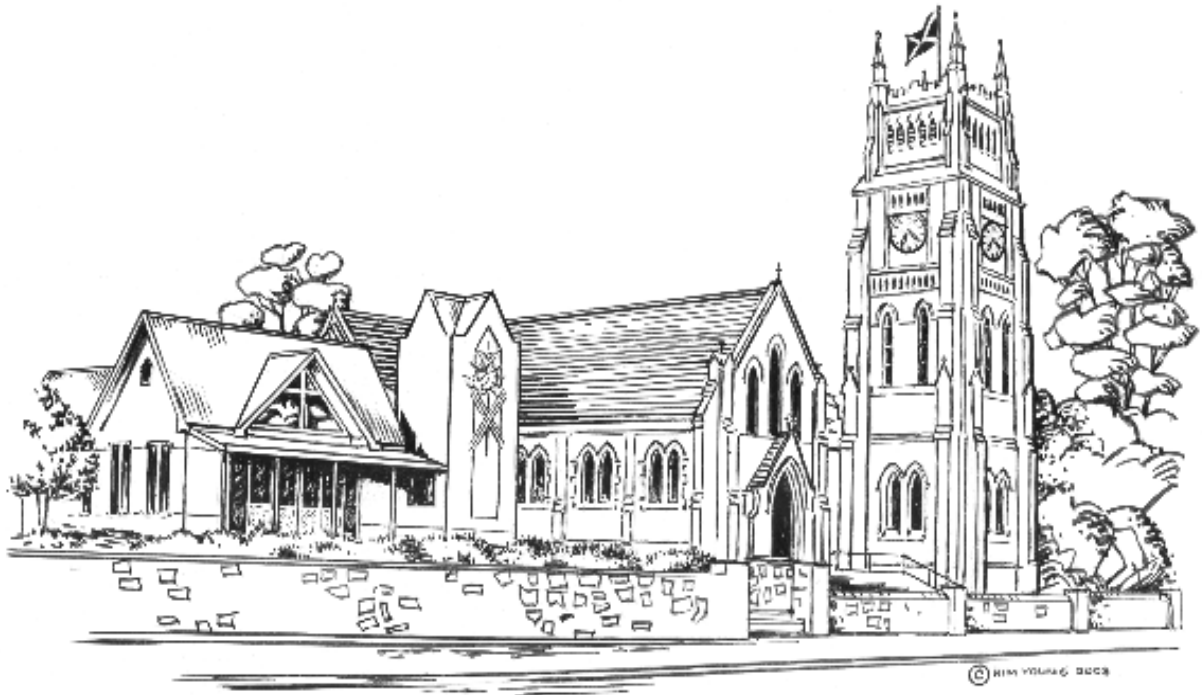

Affirmation of Faith (please stand)

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church.

**We believe in one God,

Please do not intinct your Communion wafer into the wine, but receive them separately.
