**Christ will come again.**

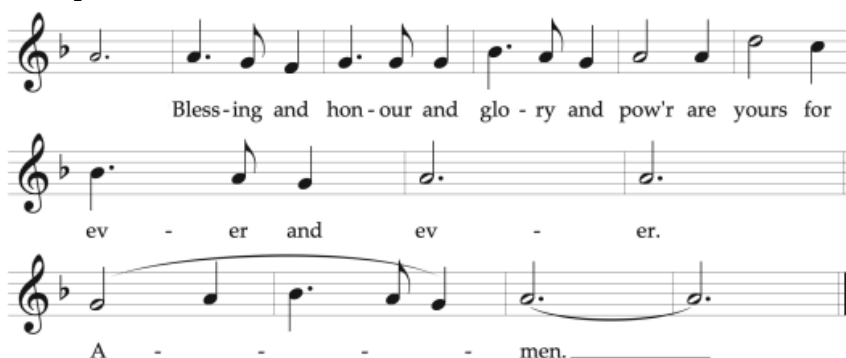


Therefore, living God, as we obey his command,

*Please do not intinct your Communion wafer into the wine, but receive them separately.*

*If you wish to receive the Ministry of Healing, please proceed to the foyer when you have received the Holy Communion.*

Bishop Dudley-Smith wrote over 450 hymns. He was one of the most prolific and influential hymn writers of the 20th and 21st centuries. His hymns are included in the hymn books of many denominations, and are greatly valued by members of this parish.  
The hymns this morning celebrate his skill and dedication to our Lord. The last hymn was written on a train journey from Nottingham to London. He wrote the last verse to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth 11 in 2022. His hymns are firmly rooted in the Scriptures and reflect his strongly held beliefs. He is survived by two daughters and a son. His wife died in 2007.  
May he rest in peace and rise in glory to sing with the angelic choirs.
