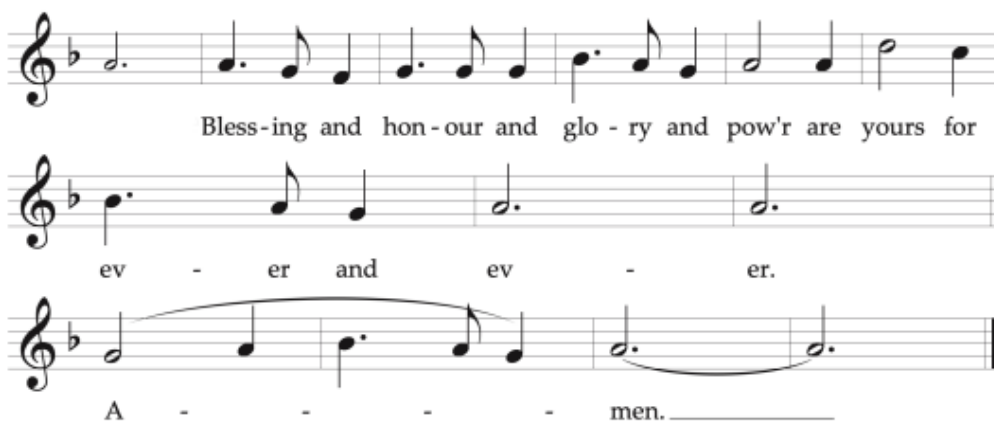

Contemplation – A long, loving look at the real

‘Contemplation has been well described as a ‘long loving look at the real’. Note that it is a deep looking more than a knee jerk thinking (which is not really thinking at all, but usually narcissistic reacting). Contemplate in Latin means to gaze at something eagerly or with intense interest. It does not mean to think about it. The non-dual contemplative mind is a whole new mind! (See Romans 12:2 and Ephesians 4:13). It is truly an entirely different “software and processing system” and, at this point in history, it must be taught, as our culture no longer practices it naturally.’
