‘My young friend, Dave has always loved the outdoors and is thoroughly at home there. After a serious accident and an arduous period of recovery, he was able to return to his beloved mountains. They were the same, but he was different. His vision had changed, his inner vision (the accident had not changed his eyes). Spiritually he now was gifted with presbyopia: his vision had become “old.” One October evening as we stood together on a bridge over the noisy little Hazel River, he said, “You can hear God in that river. I used to get stuck on the idea of a God who was far away, scary, mad at me. ‘Now I can’t get over how much God loves me. And I can’t get over how amazing everything is.”
