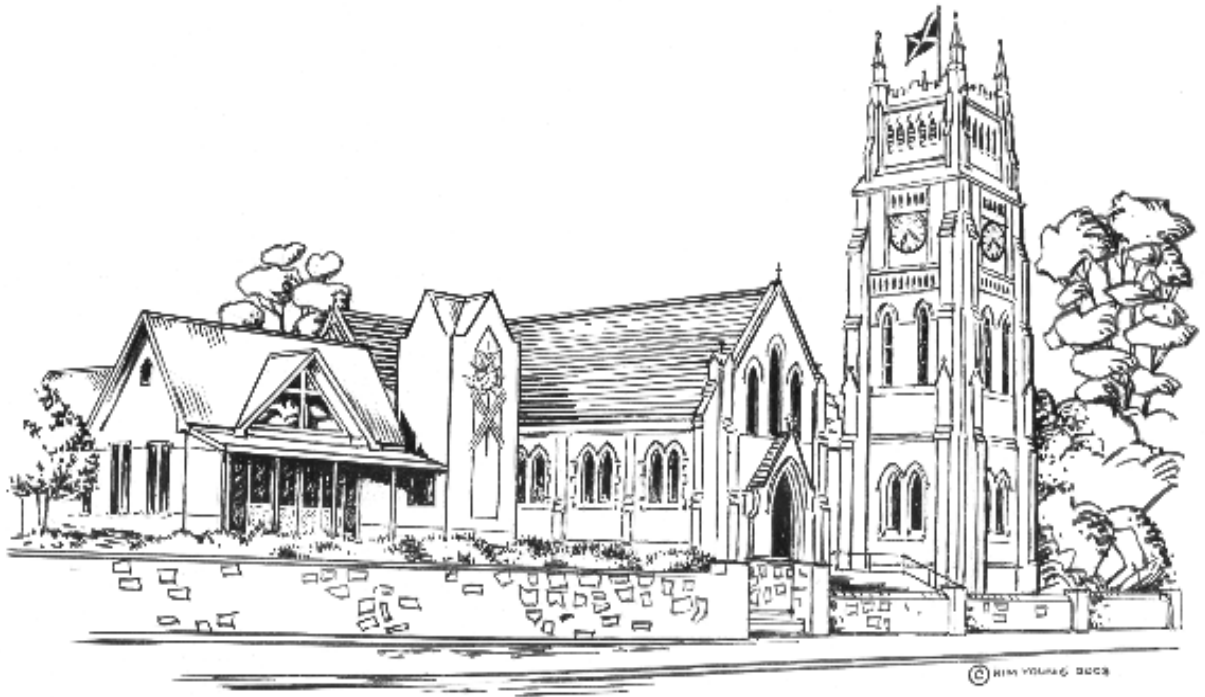

The musical score is written in G major (one flat) and 4/4 time. It consists of two systems of two staves each.
