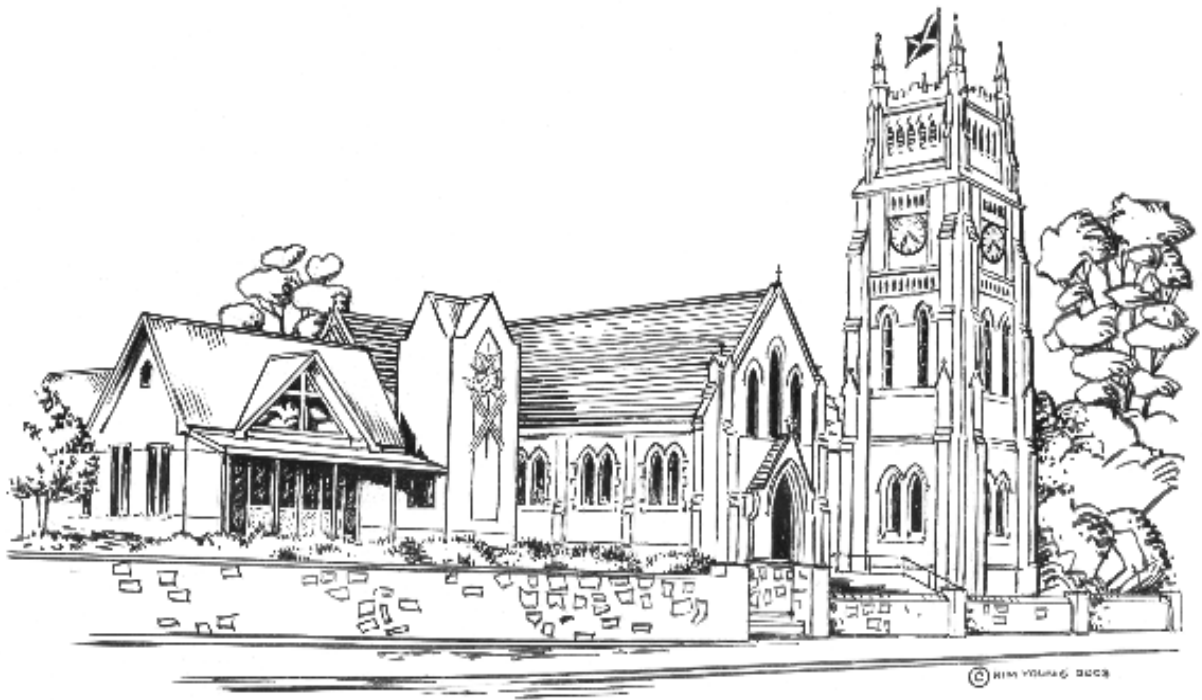

**Christ has died.**

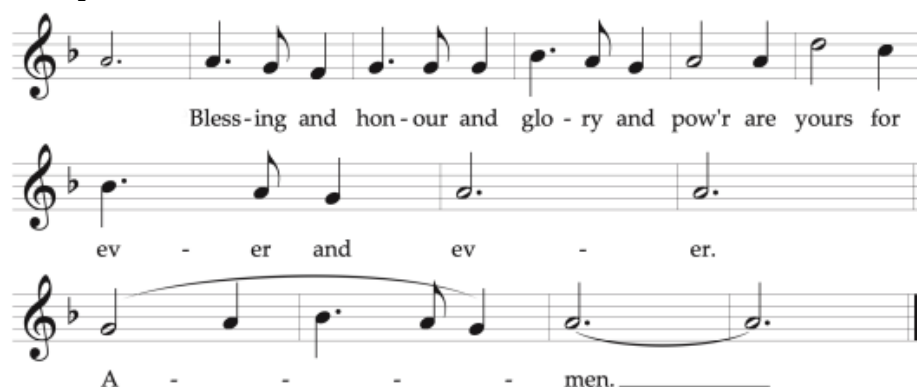

(please sit or kneel)

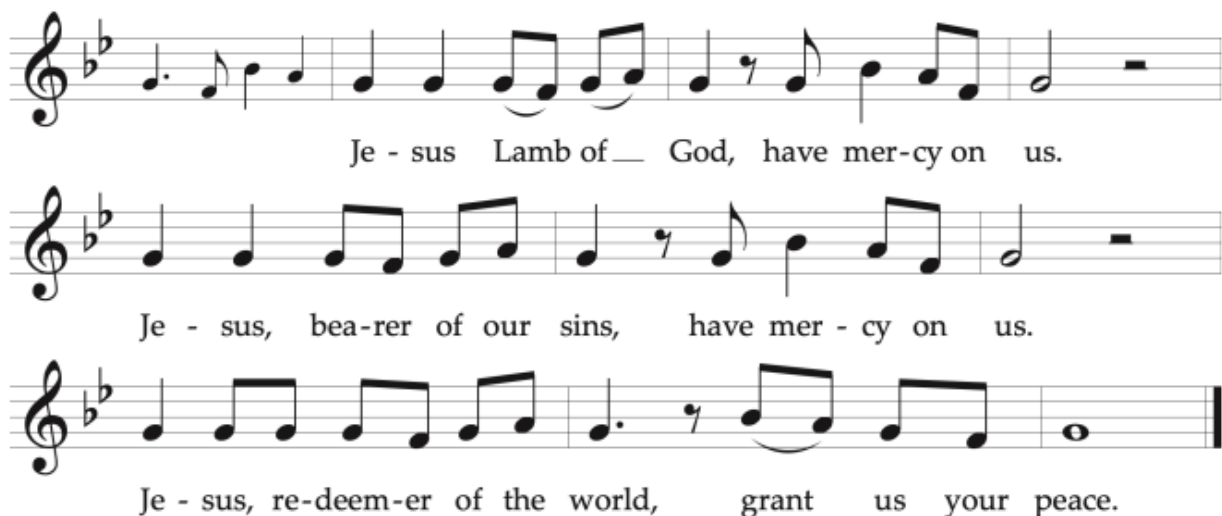
**Our Father in heaven,
