Christ has died;

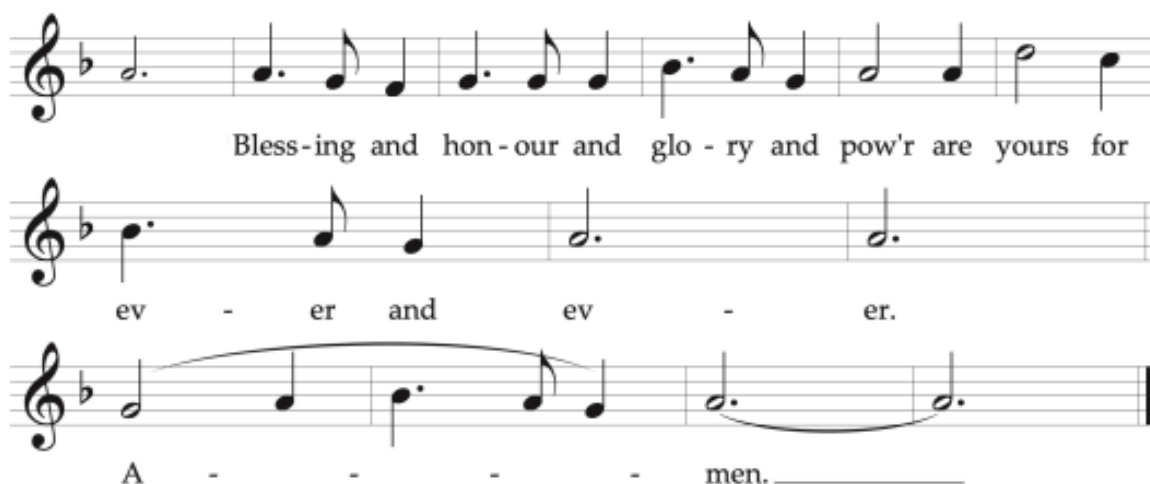
Christ is risen;

As our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are confident to pray:

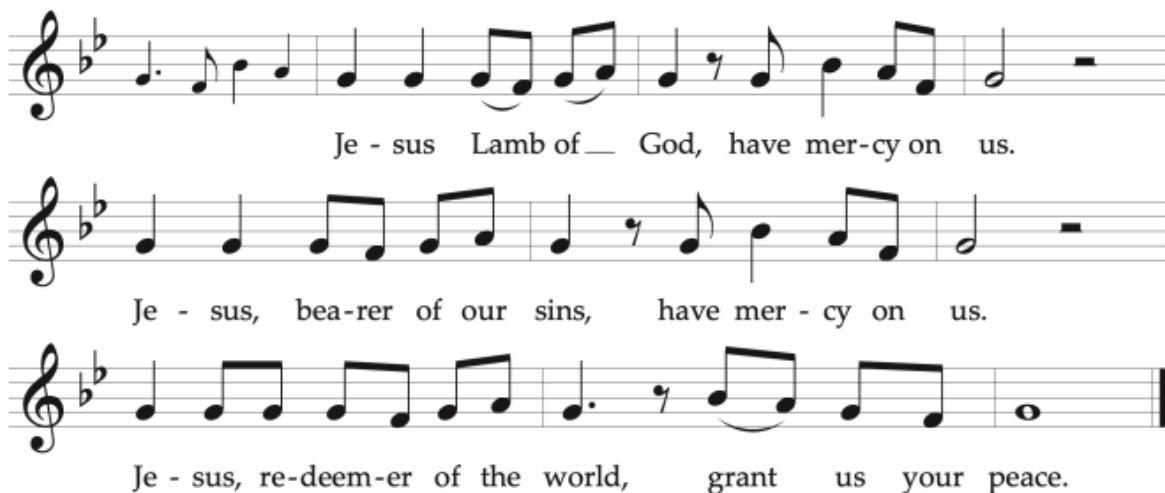
