



Children's Talk

First Reading: Acts 9: 1-6 After the reading Hear the word of the Lord, **thanks be to God.**

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest.




And now we thank you for these gifts of bread and wine; may we who receive them, as Jesus said, share his body and his blood.

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith: (sung at 9.30am)






You have gathered us together to feed on Christ and to remember all he has done for us:

Blessing and honour, glory and power, are yours for ever and ever, Amen.




The Breaking of Bread and Communion

Invitation to Communion

Administration of Communion

All who wish to receive Holy Communion are invited to come forward at the appropriate time. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please also come forward and indicate this by bowing your head. Gluten-free bread is available upon request.

We kindly ask that you receive the bread and wine separately rather than dipping the wafer into the cup.

If you wish to receive the Ministry of Healing, please proceed to the foyer when you have received the Holy Communion.
