Christ will come again.



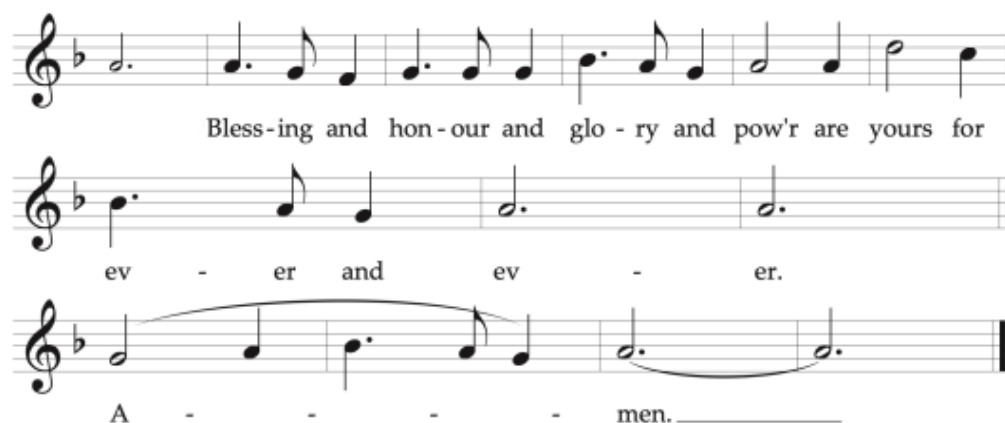
Therefore we do as our Saviour has commanded:
