

Holy God, we thank you



Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.




Therefore we do as our Saviour has commanded:

The Breaking of Bread and Communion


We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All who wish to receive Holy Communion are invited to form a single-file line and kneel/stand at the Altar rail when a space is available. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please also come forward and indicate this by bowing your head.

Gluten-free bread is available upon request.

We kindly ask that you receive the bread and wine separately rather than dipping the wafer into the cup.

If you wish to receive the Ministry of Healing, please proceed to the foyer when you have received the Holy Communion.
