In drought-affected Zimbabwe, Lucia is raising nine children while farming in a region where rivers have dried up. Through the Christmas Bowl and their partner Christian Care, she has learned new techniques to grow food, rear chickens, and provide for her family. Climate change is forcing farmers to adapt as droughts, floods and storms make survival harder. With support from the Christmas Bowl, Christian Care is training families in conservation farming, livestock rearing, and wetland rehabilitation to build resilience and secure food and income. For Lucia, this means food on the table, eggs to sell, and the confidence her children can stay in school. The Purple Bench project was first set up in Nova Scotia, Canada in 2015 and purple benches are now springing up, worldwide. Painted bright purple, each bench is situated in a public place and displays a plaque, in memory of those who have died through domestic or family violence. The bench also displays crisis helpline numbers for those who find themselves in need. Purple is associated with the global Domestic Violence Awareness Movement.

The Anglican Diocese of Adelaide's domestic & family violence working group supports the installation of purple benches in church and public spaces to honour all victim-survivors of domestic & family violence.



The dedication of this bench seeks to publicly reflect the commitment of the Diocese of Adelaide to the Anglican Church of Australia's Ten Commitments for the prevention of and response to domestic and family violence
