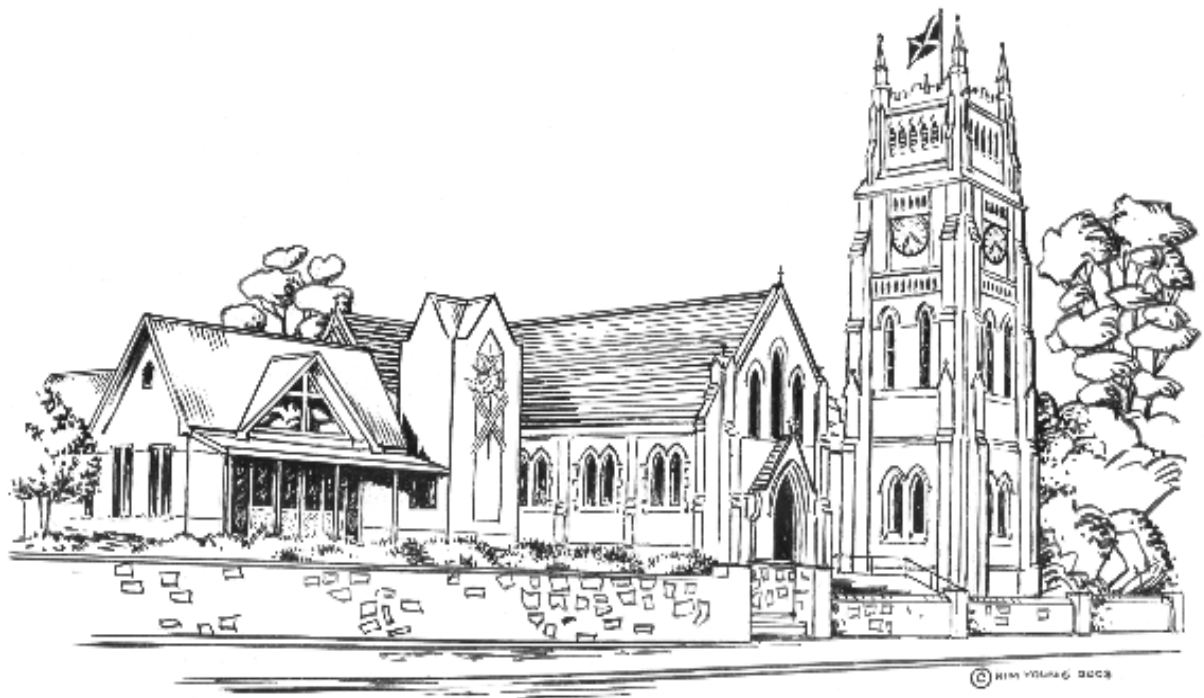

Children's Talk

First Reading: Acts 2: 42-47

⁴² They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. ⁴³ Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All who believed were together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵ they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶ Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

¹⁰ Once you were not a people,
but now you are God's people;
once you had not received mercy,
but now you have received mercy.

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BIBLE STUDY GROUPS

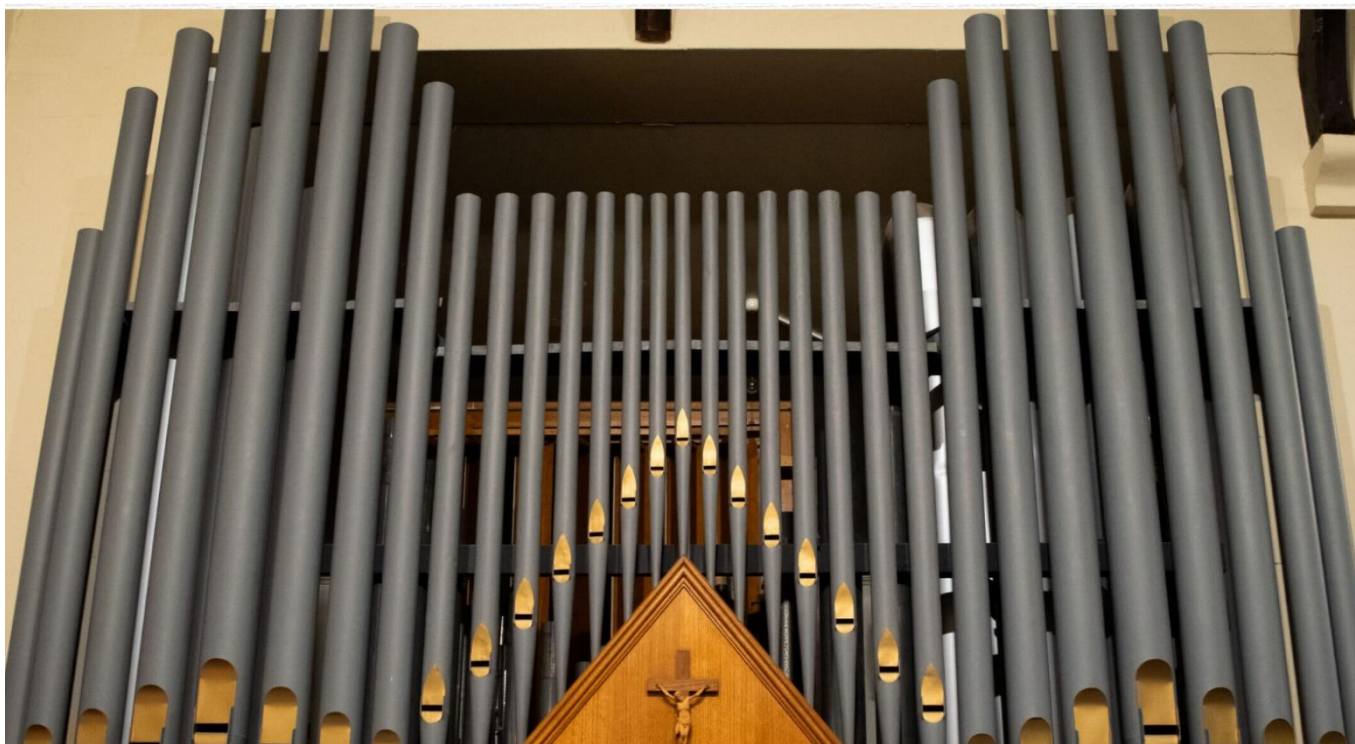
'Life through the Bible' is the focus for the group that usually meets on the **2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month between 11.00am and 12.30pm**, currently at the home of **Heather and Brian Wheatley**, 28B Church Terrace. Following a short time over a 'cuppa' the group, currently ten in number, spends about an hour prayerfully exploring and expanding our understanding of The Bible, The Gospel and the application to our lives. Sometimes we will look at a particular Book of the Bible such as Revelation or Daniel; while at other times we have explored topics such as Women in the New Testament, or Jesus' relationship within the Book of Psalms. We use a combination of published study guides, on-line resources and video presentations. The group chooses what to study next, and we have just begun exploring the 'Acts of the Apostles' as a natural sequence following our Lenten and Easter journey.

Evening Home Fellowship meets on the **1st and 3rd Thursdays at 7.30pm** at **Ray and Sue Newell's**. We are currently using the Lectionary readings for the following Sunday as a basis for our Bible Study, and have also studied a number of the major books of the Bible in-depth.
