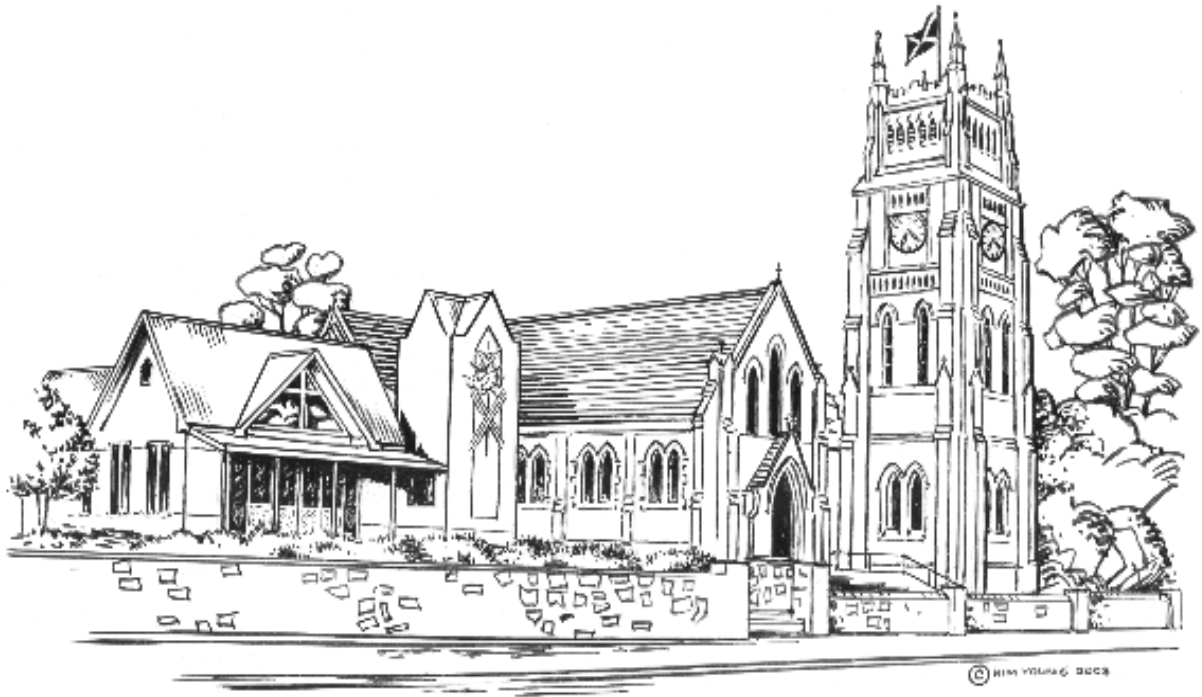

### *Explanation of Pentecost (or Processional) Symbols*

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit is described in different ways, not just to be understood, but to be experienced.

These symbols help us recognise how the Spirit is at work, in our school, and in our church.

#### *School Banner – Sophie Arnold*

This banner represents our school community, a place of learning, growth, and relationships.

The Holy Spirit is present here, in classrooms, in playgrounds, and in everyday moments guiding, encouraging, and shaping lives.

#### *Church Banner – Jessica Kumar*

This banner represents our church community, a place of gathering, worship, and belonging.

The Holy Spirit is present here, drawing us together, and sending us out to live what we believe.

#### *Fish – Alys Key, Noella Jones*

The fish is a symbol closely connected with St Andrew, one of the first disciples called by Jesus.

In our school and parish, the fish reminds us that we are all invited to follow, in how we learn, how we grow, and how we care for others.

*Fire Artwork – Luke Ritchie, Principal, St Andrew's School*

Fire is a symbol of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost,  
not to destroy, but to ignite.

In our school and parish,  
the fire reminds us that the Spirit is at work,  
igniting courage and sparking what is new.

*Wind Artwork – Fiona Brady*

The Spirit is like the wind,  
we cannot see it, but we can feel it moving.

In our school and our church,  
the Spirit stirs what is still,  
and opens us to what is new.

*Dove Artwork – Ann Hurst*

The dove is a symbol of peace and presence.  
It reminds us that the Spirit comes gently,  
bringing calm and reassurance.
