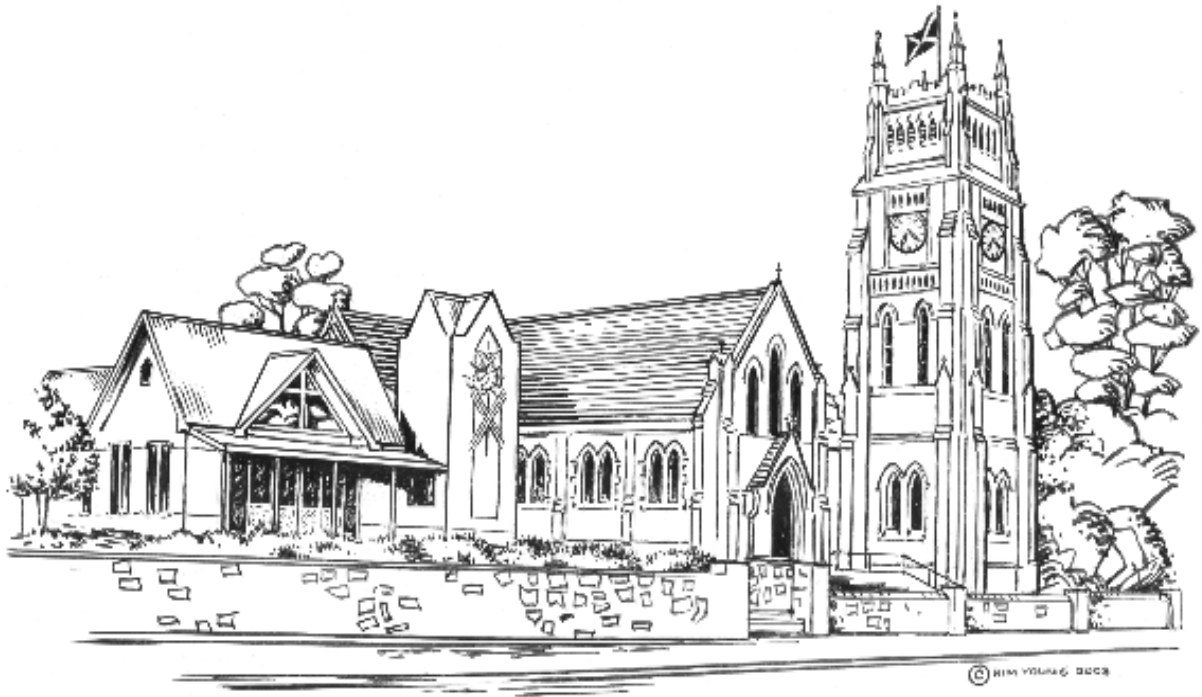

Children's Talk

First Reading: Genesis 24: 34-38; 42-49; 58-67

³⁴ So he said, 'I am Abraham's servant.
³⁵ The Lord has greatly blessed my master, and he has become wealthy;
he has given him flocks and herds, silver and gold,
male and female slaves, camels and donkeys.
³⁶ And Sarah my master's wife bore a son to my master
when she was old; and he has given him all that he has.
³⁷ My master made me swear, saying, "You shall not take a wife
for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, in whose land I live;
³⁸ but you shall go to my father's house, to my kindred,
and get a wife for my son."
⁴² 'I came today to the spring, and said, "O Lord, the God of my master
Abraham, if now you will only make successful the way I am going!
⁴³ I am standing here by the spring of water; let the young woman
who comes out to draw, to whom I shall say, 'Please give me a little
water from your jar to drink,'

So I drank, and she also watered the camels.

So I put the ring on her nose, and the bracelets on her arms.

59 So they sent away their sister Rebekah and her nurse
along with Abraham's servant and his men.

may your offspring gain possession of the gates of their foes.'
61 Then Rebekah and her maids rose up, mounted the camels,
and followed the man; thus the servant took Rebekah,
and went his way.
62 Now Isaac had come from Beer-lahai-roi,
and was settled in the Negeb.
63 Isaac went out in the evening to walk in the field;
and looking up, he saw camels coming.
64 And Rebekah looked up, and when she saw Isaac,
she slipped quickly from the camel,
65 and said to the servant, 'Who is the man over there,
walking in the field to meet us?' The servant said, 'It is my master.'
So she took her veil and covered herself.
66 And the servant told Isaac all the things that he had done.
67 Then Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent.
He took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her.

of death? ²⁵ Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

flesh I am a slave to the law of sin.

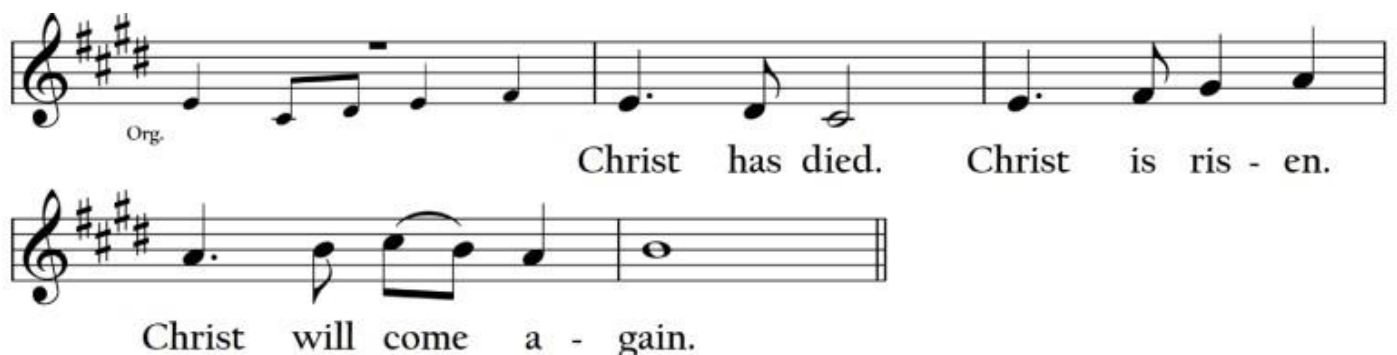

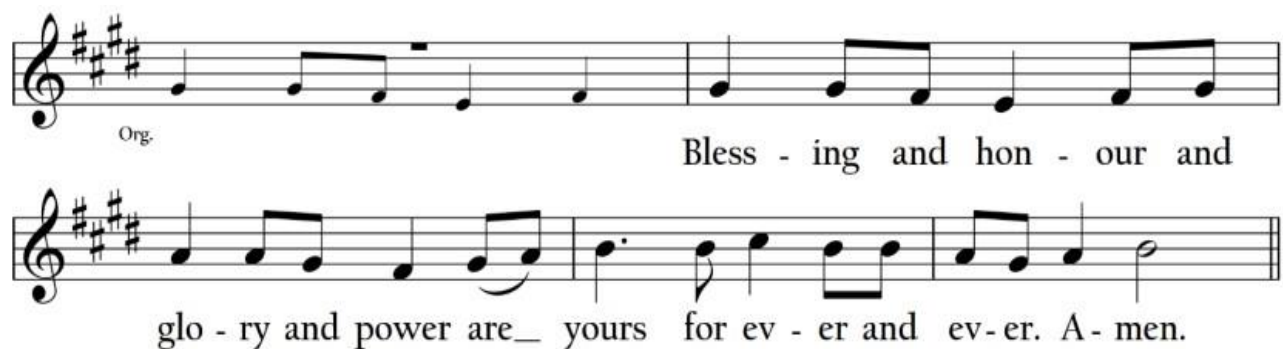


Therefore we do as our Saviour has commanded:
